




HIV response has achieved notable success in declining new infections globally and regionally, but during the past 7 years the decline in new HIV infections has stalled




A significant variation in new HIV infections trends in Asia and the Pacific countries

280 000 new HIV infections in Asia and the Pacific in 2017



EXPANDING SHARE OF NEW HIV INFECTIONS AMONG MEN WHO HAVE SEX WITH MEN








Young people (15-24) as proportion of total new HIV infections, 2017




New HIV infections will escalate if we continue "business as usual"













PrEP availability through pilot/demonstration sites or national rollout, January 2019

HIV testing is the entry point for prevention and treatment but about half of key populations do not know their HIV status


HIV testing coverage among key populations, 2014 - 2017

Outcomes:

- Developed 13 country-level road maps for PrEP & HIVST
- 2. Facilitated robust discussion, challenged misconceptions, enabled cross-country collaboration & shared learnings
- 3. Built momentum for action in-country and regionally
- 4. Identified information gaps and gaps in global guidance
- 5. Strengthened partnerships

13 countries: Bangladesh; Cambodia; China; India; Indonesia; Lao PDR; Myanmar; Pakistan; Papua New Guinea; Philippines; Thailand; Vietnam.

PRIORITIES FOR PROGRESS

PrEP

- Remove regulatory barriers
- Create supportive policies
- Ensure PrEP is affordable
- Simplify PrEP delivery
 - Service differentiation and innovation
- Integrate PrEP with other services
- Mobilise the community to build awareness, knowledge and demand
- Build clinician knowledge and comfort
- Rollout at scale

HIV self-testing

- Remove regulatory barriers
- Create supportive policies
 - Incorporation into existing policies
 - Age of consent for testing aligning with risk
- Mobilise the community to build awareness, knowledge and demand
- Create a system for strong links between HIVST and care

- Move beyond pilots to begin implementation
 - Streamline monitoring and evaluation
 - Active engagement of all stakeholders
