Journey of AIDS by the numbers

Since the beginning of the epidemic -

Globally...

75 million people have become infected with HIV (Population size of Turkey)

32 million people have died from AIDS-related illnesses (Population size of Canada)

In Asia and the Pacific...

12 million people have become infected with HIV (Almost twice the population size of Lao PDR)

6 million people have died from AIDS-related illnesses (Population size of Singapore)

new infections


More than **4.2 million**



HIV response has achieved notable success in declining new infections globally and regionally, but during the past 8 years the decline in new HIV infections has stalled Global

ART coverage (%) ■ < 30% ■ 30-59% ■ 60-80% ■ ≥ 81% ■ Treatment gap



PLHIV aware of status but NOT on treatment


PLHIV aware of status and on treatment

Some good practices on city AIDS response in Asia

Bangkok, Thailand

Using local evidence to inform programs for key population

- Almost a 3rd of Thais living with HIV are in Bangkok
- Percentage of PLWH in Bangkok who know their HIV status increased to 79% (66% in 2014)
- Bangkok leadership is now focusing on the "2nd 90" (60% now) and "3rd 90" (70% now)

Addressing stigma and discrimination in health care settings

Ho Chi Min, Viet Nam

- Pilot initiative to reduce discrimination in health care setting in 3 health facilities engaging Vietnam network of PLWH, Vietnam Administration for HIV/AIDS Control (VAAC), Ho Chi Minh City Provincial AIDS Center and UNAIDS
- Informed the development of national plan to reduce HIV related S & D in healthcare setting



Some good practices on city AIDS response in Asia

Jakarta, Indonesia

Innovative digital solutions to reach young people

- In 2018, only 55% of people living with HIV in Jakarta knew their HIV status
- Innovative solutions using digital platforms to reach young key populations, like Tanya Marlo chatbot, Update Status website, etc.

End the AIDS epidemic in cities by 2030

- Leadership of Melaka Mayor to start
- Sub-national analysis of data
- Expanded to 9 cities now
