



HIV testing and treatment cascade, Asia and the Pacific, 2020









The pace of treatment scale up is not fast enough to catch up with the treatment targets: uneven progress in Asia Pacific countries

Annual net increase on people receiving treatment in Asia Pacific region, 2015-2020





Distribution of countries (n=20) with respect to the evolution of gaps to the first and second 90s



Epidemic mostly affecting key populations and their partners. Key Populations remain criminalized in most countries


Distribution of new HIV infections by population, 2020







Relationship between HIV testing coverage and innovative HIV testing approaches

Inequalities in innovative HIV testing service provision left many key populations underserved





















Snapshot of HIV among young people (15-24 years) in Asia-Pacific



From testing to treatment: Missed opportunities to prevent onward transmission and AIDS-related deaths


Proportion of PLHIV who know their HIV status and who are on treatment - by policy on same day initiation of ART, Asia and the Pacific, 2018-2019









Same-day ART initiation scale-up in time of COVID-19 pandemic




MMD scale-up in time of COVID-19 to minimize service disruption




