

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Executive Summary

Background

India has an estimated 2.4 million people infected with HIV and unprotected paid sex remains a key factor in its continued spread, particularly in the southern states. The National AIDS Control Organization (NACO) has classified Bellary district as one of the highest prevalence districts in Karnataka. In October 2005, approximately 3,129 female sex workers (FSWs) were mapped in Bellary district, of which approximately 15.7% were estimated to be HIV infected. Sex work in Bellary urban is predominantly home-based with FSWs soliciting sex in public places across the city, and mostly entertaining their clients in a home setting.

The India AIDS Initiative, *Avahan*, of the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation (BMGF) was established in 2003 with the aim of slowing down the HIV epidemic in India through targeted, integrated large-scale HIV prevention programmes with high-risk populations such as FSWs in six high prevalence states of India. The HIV prevention programme was initiated in Bellary in November 2004, with the support of the implementing NGO called Myrada. As part of monitoring and evaluation of the *Avahan* programmes, quantitative 'special behavioural surveys' (SBS) and 'integrated behavioural and biological assessment' (IBBA) surveys were conducted with FSWs to examine sex work characteristics, condom use and sexual behaviours with regular partners and clients, alcohol and drug use, and knowledge and use of the HIV prevention programme services.

Subjects and methods

This quantitative SBS study was conducted with FSWs in urban Bellary district from December 2005 to July 2006. One round of face to face interviews (FTFI) and one round of informal confidential voting interviews (ICVI) were conducted with FSWs. The sampling methodology adopted for the SBS was the same as for the IBBA surveys. Women were selected from across Bellary district using time location cluster random sampling, with numbers in each cluster proportional to total population size estimates. Questionnaires were conducted in the main language, Kannada, by trained members of Myrada. Data was double-entered in Microsoft Access and analysed using Stata, version 10.

Results

A total of 397 FSWs participated in this study – SBS-FTFI (198) and SBS-ICVI (199). Response rates were high at 95% (198/209) and 96% (199/209), respectively. The mean age of participants was 29 years and the majority (80%) was illiterate. In the SBS-FTFI, most were either currently married (25%) or had previously been married but were now separated, widowed, divorced or had been deserted by their husband (41%).

FSWs were recruited for the study from public places, brothels, and home-based settings. For the purposes of the SBS-FTFI analysis, we classified FSW sex work typology according to their response to a question about where they *usually* solicit most of their clients. Over half (53%) of the participants reported usually soliciting clients in home-based settings, 35% reported public places and a minority reported soliciting from brothels (12%).

Participants started selling sex at an average age of 21.4 years and had worked an average of seven years. Nearly half of the participants (48%) reported having no alternate source of income and sold sex for an average of 16 days each month and entertaining an average of 2-3 clients per working day. Although vaginal sex was the main type of sex sold to clients, approximately 18% of the participants in the SBS-FTFI and SBS-ICVI reported having had anal sex at some point.

Over half of the FSWs in the SBS-FTFI (57%) had a husband or a cohabiting partner, of whom a quarter knew of their sex work. Consistent condom use with husbands and cohabiting partners was low with over half of participants in the SBS-FTFI reporting never using condoms with this partner. Moreover, over 60% of women in the SBS-FTFI reported that their regular male partner also had sexual relationships with other women.

Among the minority (28%) who reported having a non-commercial partner (NC) other than their husband or cohabiting partner in the SBS-FTFI, approximately half reported using a condom the last time they had sex with their most recent NC partner. Less than half of the participants in the SBS-ICVI reported using a condom at last sex with this partner.

All women had new/occasional clients and 46% reported having repeat clients. In the SBS-FTFI, condom use with commercial sexual partners (both repeat and new/occasional clients) was relatively high with approximately three-quarters of women with these partner types always using a condom with them. Rates of condom use at last sex with these commercial partners were reported by ICVI and FTFI respondents at over 90%.

Nearly all participants (94.4%) reported previous contact with a PE/NGO worker and having witnessed a condom demonstration. Approximately 76% of the participants who were contacted by a PE/NGO worker reported ever having had visiting a NGO-run clinic; and of the women who had ever visited the clinic, 88% reported having had received a 'grey pack' containing 1g Azithromycin and 400mg Cefiximine for presumptive treatment of chlamydia and gonorrhoea. In addition, participants had known of HIV/AIDS for an average of two years and nearly two-thirds of respondents (64%) reported having ever taken an HIV/AIDS test.

Poor mental health was evident among the study population with approximately 40% to 50% of FSWs in the SBS-FTFI reported being intoxicated during sexual intercourse. Furthermore, nearly one-fifth of the participants reported that they had been beaten or otherwise physically forced to have sexual intercourse within the past year.

Discussion

Considering the early stage of the programme at the time of the survey, the findings suggest that the HIV prevention programme in Bellary district was having a significant impact on sex worker condom use and use of sexual health services in the district. Although high levels of PE/NGO worker contact, condom demonstrations, HIV testing, and rates of reported condom use with clients were reported, there was a substantially lower reported rate of condom use with regular non-commercial partners, cohabiting lovers and husbands.

Additionally, all brothel-based sex workers in the study were dependent on sex work for their livelihoods and were more likely to work a greater number of days per month.

Correspondingly, they had a greater number of clients per month as compared to other sex work typologies. High rates of alcohol consumption were also more likely to be reported by brothel-based FSWs. Thus, given the increased levels of risk brothel-based sex workers face, additional interventions targeting this subgroup of FSWs may be necessary.

Furthermore, the potentially high level of sexual mixing that may be occurring between some FSW regular partners, and other women, suggests that continuing interventions with FSWs and their regular partners are necessary.

Finally, given high rates of alcohol use reported by this population, there is an indication that poor mental health is a significant problem among FSWs in Bellary district. Despite the early signs of collectivization among the FSWs in Bellary, the study suggests a clear need to focus on interventions that address the larger socioeconomic factors and enable marginalized and vulnerable women such as these to earn money through alternative means, in addition to interventions that facilitate improving their mental health.

Introduction

The HIV epidemic in India

India is the second most populous country in the world and has an estimated 2.4 million people living with HIV/AIDS [1-2]. The epidemic is highly heterogeneous with HIV prevalence rates highest in the four southern states of Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu, and the two north-eastern states of Manipur and Nagaland [1, 3]. Unprotected paid sex is thought to be a key factor in its continued spread, particularly in the southern states, where rates among female sex workers (FSW) and also among men who have sex with men (MSM) have reached over 30% in some districts [1]. Indeed, mathematical modelling suggests that HIV prevention interventions targeted at FSWs alone could halt the HIV epidemic in this country, if applied at sufficient scale and quality [4].

The India AIDS Initiative, Avahan

The India AIDS Initiative, *Avahan*, of the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation was established in 2003 with the aim of slowing down the HIV epidemic in India through targeted, integrated large-scale HIV prevention programmes with high-risk populations in 83 districts in the six high prevalence states of India and in 17 sites along the National Highways [5]. The programmes target FSWs and their clients, men who have sex with men (MSM), hijras (transgendered people) and injecting drug users (IDUs) and are tailored to the local situation and needs. Key programme components include: (i) focused HIV and STI prevention peer education outreach, with an emphasis on condom promotion and provision, (ii) behaviour change programmes for HIV and STI risk reduction among regular partners of FSWs, (iii) improved quality and accessibility of high-quality STI management services for FSWs and their partners and (iv) key population (FSW / MSM / transgender) collectivisation and community mobilisation.

Bellary, Karnataka state

Karnataka state is situated in the south of India and has a population of 53 million people (2001 census). The capital of the state is Bangalore and Kannada is the main language spoken. It is a predominantly Hindu state (83%), with Islam (11%) and Christianity (4%) also practiced (2001 census).

Situated on the eastern part of Karnataka, Bellary district is famous for iron and manganese ore and has mining operations. The district is bordered by Raichur, Haveri, Chitradurga, Karnool and Ananthapur Districts and has two main rivers, the Tungabhadra and the Hagari. Another well known international tourist spot which is also a heritage site is Hampi, which is 15 kilometers away from Hospet town.

As per the 2001 census, the population is 2,027,000 with 70% living in rural areas. The major occupation in this district is agriculture (cotton, jowar, ground nut, paddy, sunflower and cereals) with 75% of the total labour force depends on agriculture for their livelihood.

Overall, Karnataka state has an estimated HIV prevalence of 0.75% among the adult population, placing it among the top four states in India with regards to HIV epidemic

severity [1]; and in particular, Bellary has been classified as one of the high prevalence district ("A" Category) in Karnataka by the National AIDS Control Organization (NACO). According to the latest available surveillance data, HIV in general population of Bellary district is 0.38%, with an HIV prevalence rate among the female sex worker population of 15.7% [6]. During a mapping done in Bellary district in October 2005, a total of 3,129 FSWs were mapped across 11 towns (KPHT Management Information System).

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Roles of NGOs and CBOs in project implementation

Funded by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation *Avahan* programme, the Myrada Soukhya Programme, supported by Karnataka Health Promotion Trust (KHPT), is a joint collaboration between an NGO, Myrada and an FSW community based organization (CBO) Soukhya. Under the programme, Myrada implements the HIV prevention interventions with sex workers in Bellary district. The Myrada Soukhya Programme began in November 2004. Following the initial mapping of the FSWs, project outreach teams consisting of peer educators were established.

Under *Avahan*, the programme focuses on three primary objectives: direct risk reduction (outreach, condom promotion and STI management); community mobilization and creating an enabling environment (focusing largely on crisis management and sensitization of key stakeholders). Myrada merged these objectives into the Soukhya programme with their own ABC4DE approach¹. While all of the *Avahan* components were incorporated into the programme interventions, Myrada also sought a more comprehensive social approach and sustainability. Therefore, strategies such as working with referral clinics, responding to non-HIV related needs of the community, and institution building within the community were explored and implemented from the first year of the programme. Both *Avahan* and KHPT provided Myrada the space and support needed to undertake these additional activities.

An additional feature of Myrada's strategy is its holistic approach of viewing sex workers as human beings. This has resulted in Myrada looking at the socio-economic and overall development of the sex worker based on her expressed needs that go beyond risk reduction of HIV/AIDS. The rationale is that if a woman is empowered in a holistic way (health, socio-economic, etc.), she will be able to address any risk factor that makes her vulnerable to HIV acquisition.

With regard to this Special Behavioural Survey (SBS) study, Myrada facilitated the fieldwork in the sex worker community in the urban areas of Bellary. Prior to the survey, Myrada met with their field staff to orient them to the study procedures and their roles in the survey. Subsequently, Myrada informed the sex worker community about the study, its aims, objectives, and how the study would proceed. During the survey, peer educators from Myrada were designated to identify the selected sites (clusters) and approach the respondents.

Monitoring and evaluation of Avahan programmes

series of surveys that measure changes in behaviours, STIs and HIV in the target population. These observational data provide parameter estimates for mathematical modelling that can estimate the number of HIV cases averted in high risk groups and the general population. The surveys include (i) cross sectional surveys called Integrated Biological and Behavioural Assessments (IBBA) which involve STI/HIV testing and face to face questionnaires with members of high-risk groups and their clients, (ii) Special Behavioural Surveys (SBS) (which

have quantitative and qualitative components) and general population surveys (GPS) and (iii) regular behavioural tracking surveys [5].

With regard to the intervention districts in Karnataka, the SBS were carried out by Centre Hospitalier *affilié* Universitaire de Québec (CHA) in partnership with KHPT, the University of Manitoba (Winnipeg, Canada) and the Institute of Population Health and Clinical Research (IPHCR), St. John's Medical College, Bangalore.


Purpose of this study

This SBS study was conducted using face to face interviews (FTFI) with 198 FSWs and informal confidential voting interviews (ICVI) with 199 FSWs from December 2005 to January 2006 (See Figure 2). The FTFI comprised a detailed questionnaire whereas the ICVI comprised a short questionnaire covering demographic characteristics followed by a short questionnaire of seventeen key behavioural questions (See Appendix 2), conducted in a more anonymous setting than a face to face interview. The main aim of the ICVI was to compare responses with face to face interview questioning.

The main aims of this quantitative SBS study were to examine:

- 1) FSW demographic characteristics;
- 2) Sex work characteristics including sex work migration;
- 3) Sexual practices and condom use with clients and non-commercial sexual partners;
- 4) Alcohol use with clients and non-commercial sexual partners;
- 5) HIV prevention programme knowledge and behaviours;
- 6) HIV/AIDS awareness and behaviours, including injection practices;
- 7) In addition, by comparing answers provided in face to face interviews with answers provided using an ICVI methodology, we aimed to gain a clearer understanding of the impact of social desirability bias on survey findings;
- 8) Enable more in-depth understanding of behavioural parameters not covered by the IBBA questionnaires, including sexual networks and concurrency.

Definitions used in the study

Female sex worker: Any woman above age of 18 who has engaged in sex work for monetary compensation in the last month and is identified in the location selected for the survey. These locations include brothels, lodges, homes, dabhas,² and public places.

The types of sex workers are distinguished by the place of solicitation. Home-based solicitations are distinguished from brothel-based ones primarily by the lack of multiple women operating from the same house. The woman may or may not be living with relatives or other non-sex working house member. Distinctions between other similar types of sex workers (e.g. non-street solicitation lodge based sex workers who live at the lodge vs. brothel based sex workers) are described by degree of control over movement and pay by gate-keepers (pimps, lodge owner/brothel owners, etc.)

Home-based sex worker: The sex worker who works at her usual place of residence (often with her other family members) and does not go out to solicit (pick-up) clients. Clients come to her by word of mouth or a broker may get them.

Brothel-based sex worker: The sex worker works in a place other than place of her residence, under a Gharwali or an agent who receives part of her earnings. A brothel generally has more than one sex worker. Clients come to the brothel or the clients are brought into the brothel through a network of pimps or brokers. The sex worker is available at the brothel most of time.

Lodge/dabha-based sex worker: The sex worker practices sex work while staying in a lodge or hotel or a dabha. She is employed by the hotel or lodge and does not have to go out to bring clients. Instead, clients come to her or are brought to her by a network of pimps and brokers. Often the terms of sex work (duration, frequency, earnings, and movement) is determined by the lodge owner/network operator.

Public places-based sex worker: The sex worker solicits (picks up) clients in public places such as streets, parks, railway stations, bus stands, market places, and cinema halls. The clients may later be entertained in lodges, homes, brothels, or public places. They mostly operate individually, without controls from the pimps, brokers, etc.

Eligibility criteria to participate in the study

- Women who report that they are currently practicing sex work
- Women who are above the age 18 years
- Women who are not under the influence of alcohol
- Women who have sound mental health

Types of partners defined for the purpose of the study are listed below:

I. Non-Commercial partners

Husband: A man who is married to the respondent either legally or customarily at the time of the survey

Cohabiting partner: A man who is not a legal husband or married to the respondent by tradition, but who has relationship (social and sexual) with the respondent and lives with the respondent

Non-commercial partners: Men who have a sexual relationship with the respondent, but they do not live with her and the relationship is non-commercial (e.g. lovers and boyfriends).

II. Commercial Partners

Repeat clients: Repeat clients are paying clients, who repeatedly visit the respondent for sex.

New/Occasional clients: New/occasional clients are paying clients, who are new/not familiar to the respondent.

Methods

Selection of the districts and samples for FSWs

In Karnataka, four districts were selected for special surveys of female sex workers: Bellary, Belgaum, Mysore and Bangalore Urban. The basic criterion for selection of districts for these surveys was a focus on those districts where an IBBA study had already been conducted by the KHPT. The sampling frame, sample size and selection procedures for the quantitative SBS were the same as those adopted in the IBBA in each district. A total of 85 clusters, that is, primary sampling units (PSUs) per district were selected and an average of 5 interviews (FTFIs and ICVIs – see below for further explanation) were carried out per selected cluster.

The selection of clusters was carried out using one of two sampling procedures, depending on the nature of the sex work site. Conventional cluster sampling methodologies were used for the selection of clusters for home-based, brothel-based, lodge-based and dabha-based sex work sites. Time-Location Cluster (TLC) sampling methodologies were used for the selection of clusters from street-based and other public place-based sex work sites. From within the selected clusters, the respondents were selected randomly.

Sampling

A target sample of 400 FSWs was determined based on the expected baseline value of the key indicator measured, i.e., consistent condom use, the magnitude of change that is desired to detect in the key indicator, confidence level, statistical power and design effect (See Appendix 1 for the detailed sampling methodology as well as the calculation of sampling weights). A two-stage sampling method was adopted: selection of sites where FSWs solicit in the first stage and the selection of respondents from the selected sites in the second stage. As noted above, home-based sites or clusters were selected using the conventional cluster sampling method and the TLC sampling method was used for the selection of street-based sites/clusters.

The SBS conducted in Bellary covered a total of 3234 clusters. Using a multi-stage sampling methodology, it was decided to select a total of 80 clusters (plus 5 clusters to allow for contingencies in the sites such as closure of a site, disruption of sex work in the site, etc.) in the district. Since two different data collection techniques were used (ICVI and FTFI), the number of interviews per cluster was distributed between these two techniques. In each cluster the respondents were allotted alternatively to one of the two interview techniques – i.e. each participating woman was interviewed using either an ICVI or FTFI survey.

Of the total of 85 clusters selected in the first sampling stage, 39 were public places, 37 were home-based clusters and 9 were brothel-based clusters. The target number of completed interviews from each selected cluster was fixed at 5 and if this number was not achieved in a cluster, the balance was covered in subsequent clusters. Within the selected cluster, the selection of the respondents was random. In home-based clusters, the team supervisor prepared a list of all the FSWs in the site, and selected the required number randomly. In sites where the available FSWs were less than or equal to five, all FSWs were selected for the

survey. A count of FSWs who were cruising in the selected time-location clusters was also maintained in street-based sites.


Face to Face Interviews (FTFIs)

A questionnaire for face to face administration was designed in English and translated into Kannada (the local language), pilot-tested with peer educators and re-designed to be culturally sensitive and context specific. It contained questions about demographic characteristics, husband /cohabiting partner, sex work and clients, sex work and migration; HIV/AIDS risk perception, injection, transfusion history and drug use and exposure to the NGO intervention prevention programme (Appendix 2). All data were double-entered using Microsoft Access and analysed using Stata (version 10).

Informal Confidential Voting Interviews (ICVIs)

Informal confidential voting interviews (ICVIs) were designed to investigate potential social desirability bias to sensitive questions experienced in face to face interviews, by blinding the interviewer to the responses of the participant. The first part of the ICVI was conducted as an informal variant of the FTFI method and included seven questions on socio-demographic characteristics. The second part incorporated respondent-completed cards, where the interviewer, who was screened from the respondent by a piece of cardboard or material, read out the questions to the respondent (Appendix 2). The respondent filled in the coded answer (circle for NO and square for YES), on the card and put it in a locked ballot box (See Figure 3). Seventeen key questions were asked using this anonymous and more confidential method.

Study procedures

Data collection took place between December 2005 and January 2006, approximately 14 months after the start of the *Avahan* HIV prevention programme. The study was implemented in cooperation with the field workers and peer educators of Myrada. These staff played a vital role in introducing potential respondents to the supervisor of the SBS research team. However, they did not play any role in the implementation of procedural aspects of the survey itself. The supervisor from the survey team selected the respondents randomly.

Ethical approval

Ethical approval for this study was granted by the Research Ethics Review Board at the Centre Hospitalier *affilié* Universitaire de Québec, Canada, the Health Research Ethics Board of the University of Manitoba, Canada and the Institutional Review Board of St. John's Medical College in Bangalore, India.

Witnessed informed consent

Witnessed verbal consent was used for the study. Verbal consent was obtained in the presence of peer educators who then gave their signatures. The study maintained complete anonymity of the participants by not recording on the questionnaire any information that could later be used to identify the respondents.

Results

A total of 346 FSWs were enumerated in the 85 selected clusters. Out of the 209 subjects invited to participate, a total of 198 women completed FTFI yielding a response rate of 95%. Similarly, 329 FSWs were enumerated for the ICVI, of whom 207 were invited for an interview. One hundred and ninety-nine women participated in the ICVI yielding a response rate of 96%. Thus, a total of 397 women took part in the two surveys conducted in the Bellary District.

Demographic characteristics (FTFI)

Table 1 summarizes the socio-demographic characteristics of the study population found in the FTFIs. Of the total 198 women interviewed, FSWs reported usually soliciting from home-based settings³ (53.0%), and public places⁴ (35.2%), and a minority in brothel-based settings⁵ (11.8%). Over 90% of the women were under the age of 39 and the mean age was found to be 28.6 years. However, all brothel-based FSWs were less than 34 years of age and the mean was considerably lower than the overall (21.9 years). The majority of the FSWs were illiterate (80.2%); yet, brothel-based FSWs were more likely to have had some level of formal education.

Caste/tribe identification and marital status varied across the three sex worker types. The majority of public place and home-based workers identified with either the scheduled castes/tribes; however, brothel-based FSWs largely (80%) did not belong to a scheduled caste or tribe. With regard to marital status, over 40% were separated, widowed, divorced, or deserted. None of the brothel-based workers was currently married and nearly 45% of home-based FSWs were devadasis⁶ (Table 1).

Family planning methods (FTFI)

Nearly equal proportions of respondents reported using condom/nirodh (39.4%) and female sterilization (35%) as their current family planning method. However, female sterilization was more likely among older FSWs (53.5%). On the contrary, brothel-based FSWs had a greater likelihood of using condoms (66.3%) to protect against pregnancy. Over a quarter (26%) of the respondents reported not using any family planning measures. This was most likely among younger women (40.7%), devadasis (34.7%), and women of the scheduled caste (32.1%) (Table 2).

Sex work history, pattern, and environment (FTFI)

The mean age of sexual debut was 15.1 years; however, the average age respondents began selling sex was 21.4 years (Table 3). Over 80% of brothel-based workers had been in sex work for less than 5 years, but the mean duration of sex work for *all* the participants was 7.2 years. Specifically, brothel-based FSWs had worked for an average of 2.8 years, home-based FSWs for 8.8 years, and street-based FSWs for 6.3 years (Table 1 and 3). Nearly half the participants (48%) were dependent on sex work for their livelihood. Those with alternative sources reported working as agricultural laborers (21.5%), followed by non-agricultural laborers, maids, or in other types of jobs. Brothel-based sex workers were completely dependent on sex work for their livelihood with no other sources of income reported (Table 1).

Overall, 90% of respondents reported living in the place of interview; and the majority (84.6%) sold sex within place of interview (Table 1). Of those who worked in the place of interview, they had done so for an average of 6.8 years, with older and more experienced FSWs, as well as devadasis more likely to have worked for longer at place of interview as compared to other FSWs (Table 4).

Brothel-based workers were different to other respondents and were more likely to live away from the place of interview, but within Bellary district. Also, they were more likely to be selling sex in places other than the place of interview (70%) (Table 1). Those most likely to live away from the place of interview and to sell sex in other places were those who were never married, those less than 25 years of age, literate, and not having alternative sources of income (Table 5) – all characteristics associated with brothel-based sex workers. A minority (3.7%) of the respondents reported having practiced sex work in any place other than the place of interview *in the past* (Table 6).

Brothel-based participants worked a greater number of days in a typical month (26.7 days) with a larger client volume reported on the last working day (8.6 clients) as compared to the overall cohort average of 16 working days per month, and 2.8 clients on the last working day (Table 7).

Independent solicitation was the primary mode of solicitation; and was reported by 89% of FSWs. Approximately 5% of the participants reported going through a broker/pimp and nearly 6% reported using a broker/pimp occasionally. Higher rates of always using a broker/pimp for solicitation were found among women who lived away from the place of interview (31.1%), brothel-based FSWs (30.4%), those never married (20.3%), younger women (14.8%), and those working for less than 5 years (13.4%). Occasional use of a broker/pimp was highest among respondents currently selling sex outside away from the place of interview (16.7%) and brothel-based workers (15.8%) (Table 8).

Most women reported that they entertained their clients at home (43.2%) with the remainder reporting someone else's home (19%), lodge (14.1%), rented room (10.4%), or public place (8.1%) (Table 9).

With regard to violence faced by FSWs, approximately 19% of the participants reported that they had been beaten or otherwise physically forced to have sexual intercourse within the past

year. This type of violence was most likely to be reported by brothel-based sex workers (43.3%), those women who were currently separated/widowed/divorced/deserted (28.8%), and women in non-scheduled castes/tribes (26.8%). In contrast, devadasis were less likely to face this type of abuse (3.7%) (Table 10).

Migration (FTFI)

As mentioned previously, approximately 15.4% reported selling sex in places away from the place of interview (Table 1) and reported doing so for an average of 3.7 years⁷ (Table 11). Of these women (n=59), nearly 80% reported selling their sex once a month and approximately 13% reported visiting more than once a week (Table 12). On average, these FSWs reported having 4.9 clients per working day while away (Table 13).

The majority (65.4%) reported always using condoms and 3.9% reported never using condoms with clients in these places (Table 14).

Husband/cohabiting partner (FTFI)

Approximately 57% of the cohort had a husband or cohabiting partner, and this was most likely among participants working in public places (68.8%) (Table 15). The mean age of husband/cohabiting partners was 37.5 years. On average, FSWs had been in a relationship with these men for 11 years, staying 10.6 months out the past 12 months with them (Table 16). Of the women with a husband/cohabiting partner, a quarter reported that their respective partner was aware of their occupation as a sex worker. However, over 60% of the women reported being aware of the fact that their husband/cohabiting partner also had sexual relationships with other women (Table 17).

Participants with a husband or cohabiting partner reported having intercourse with him an average of 5.4 times per month with younger FSWs, devadasis, and literate women more likely to report higher rates of sexual intercourse per month (7.3, 6.7, and 6.5 times, respectively) (Table 18).

Condom use with husband/main cohabiting partner

Condom use with husbands or cohabiting partners was considerably low with over half (54.3%) reporting never using condoms with these partners. Never use with these partners was predominant among younger women, devadasis, and public place FSWs (77%, 71.6%, and 62%, respectively), although the numbers were small. Approximately 15% reported always using condoms with their husbands/cohabiting partners. This behaviour was more likely to occur among FSWs who were older, literate, and separated/widowed/divorced/deserted (25.1%, 26%, and 22.3%, respectively) and least likely to occur among those identifying with a non-scheduled caste/tribe (6.9%) (Table 18). Furthermore, less than 40% of women with a husband/cohabiting partner reported using a condom the last time they had sex with this partner. Scheduled tribe women, those separated/widowed/divorced/ or deserted, and those working as sex workers less than five years were most likely to have used a condom the last time they had sex with their husband/cohabiting partner (Table 19).

Encouragingly, of the women who reported using a condom with their husband/cohabiting partner (n=51), the majority (54.2%) reported that they had done so in order to prevent HIV transmission. Similarly, 30% reported they had used condoms to avoid getting other STIs. Other reasons reported by FSWs for using condoms were family planning, lack of trust in her partner, FSW imposed its use, and that her partner was aware that she was a sex worker (approximately 20% FSWs reported each of these reasons) (Table 20).

Conversely, the most common reason reported for not using a condom was because their respective husband/cohabiting partner did not want to use them (44%). A further 32% reported simply not being able to use them with their partner, along with the fact that he was not a client (26.8%); 19.4% reported their partner was not aware that she was a sex worker making a suggestion of condom use difficult. Other reasons included that a mutual trust existed between the FSW and her partner, their partner did not find it pleasurable when using a condom, and that the FSW wanted to conceive a child (Table 21).

Non-commercial sexual partners (FTFI)

Approximately 30% of the cohort reported having non-commercial partner/s (n=57) (Table 22). The mean age of the most recent non-commercial sex partner (NC) was 31.6 years when they first had sex; with the duration of sexual relationship averaging 3.4 years (Table 23). Approximately 8.5% of the women who reported ever having had a NC partner revealed that their *most recent* NC partner had lived with them at some time. Over 56% of these women reported that their most recent NC partner was aware of her sex work (Table 24). Moreover, nearly 80% of these women reported that their most recent NC partner had sexual relationships with other women (Table 25).

Less than 17% of FSWs who had ever had a NC partner said that they financially supported one at the time of interview. Conversely, nearly 80% of those who had ever had a NC partner reported that they are currently supported financially by such a partner (Table 26).

Condom use with most recent non-commercial partner

Of those with an NC sex partner (n=57), 30.7% reported never using a condom with the most recent such partner and approximately half (49.4%) reported always using a condom with this partner (Table 27). FSWs who reported always using condoms with this partner type (n=24) had been doing so for an average of 1.2 years. Furthermore, the majority of these women (63.6%) reported using a condom with this partner the last time they had sex (Table 28).

In contrast to the main reason FSWs reported condom use with husbands/cohabiting partners, the most common reason reported for using a condom with the most recent NC sex partner was because this partner knew she was a sex worker (49.7%). Other reasons included protection from HIV transmission (31.7%), the sex worker imposed its use (24.9%), the sex partner insisted on its use (16.1%), to avoid getting other STIs (12.3%), family planning (12.3%), and the fact that the FSW did not trust the sex partner (5.8%) (Table 29).

Commercial clients - Repeat clients (FTFI)

Nearly half of all the FSWs (46.1%) reported having repeat clients. Those participants who were literate, had a longer duration of sex work (10+ years), and older (35+ years of age) were more likely to have repeat clients than illiterate, younger and less experienced women

(63.3%, 57.5%, and 55.5%, respectively) (Table 15). At the time of interview, FSWs with repeat clients reported having an average of 2.8 repeat clients concurrently (Table 30).

The mean age of the *most recent* repeat client was 35.1 years (Table 30). On average, the respondents first had sex with their most recent repeat client 2.9 years prior to the survey, with older FSWs and more experienced FSWs, as well as tribal women most likely to have had longer relationships (5.2, 4.3, and 4 years, respectively) (Table 31). Furthermore, nearly 90% reported that their most recent repeat client was currently married, with the remainder separated/widowed (Table 32). Nearly three-quarters of FSWs reported being aware that their most recent repeat client also had sexual relations with other women. This was most likely to be seen among older and more experienced FSWs, devadasis, and home-based workers (84.3%, 96.3%, 87%, and 82.8%, in that order) (Table 33).

The average time since last sex with the most recent repeat client was 1.7 weeks (Table 34).

Condom use with most recent repeat clients

Overall, condom use at last sex with the most recent repeat clients was reported by the majority of participants (94.4%) who reported having repeat clients. Nearly three-quarters of the women reported always using condoms with this client. However, lower rates were more likely among those currently married (63%), public place FSWs (65.4%), and unusually those with other sources of income (66.5%). Over 5% reported never using condoms with this client. This was most likely among FSWs in the scheduled tribe (10.4%), younger FSWs (9.3%), and devadasis (8.8%), although numbers were small (Table 35).

2nd and 3rd most recent repeat clients

Of those women who have 2^{nd} or 3^{rd} most recent repeat clients (n=65 and n=36, respectively), the mean age of the 2^{nd} most recent repeat client was 36.2 (3^{rd} most recent was 35) (Table 36). The majority (83.6%) of 2^{nd} most recent repeat client was reported as currently married (Table 37); however, marital status of 3^{rd} most recent repeat clients was more varied (Table 38).

On average, FSWs had been in a relationship with 2nd most recent repeat client for 2.1 years, and slightly lower for 3rd most recent repeat client at 1.5 years (Table 39 and 40). Mean duration since last sex acts with these clients were 3 months and 0.6 month, respectively (Table 41 and 42).

Condom use with 2nd and 3rd most recent repeat clients

The majority of FSWs report that they always use condoms with their 2nd and 3rd most recent repeat clients (both 74%). On the other hand, sex workers were more likely to report never using condoms with their 2nd most recent repeat clients than with their 3rd most recent repeat clients (3.2% versus 1.7%) (Table 43 and 44).

Commercial clients - New/occasional clients (FTFI)

All 198 participating FSWs had new or occasional clients. Unfortunately, the general demographics for this population of clients are not available from this survey.


Condom use with new/occasional clients

Condom use with new/occasional clients was relatively high with nearly 75% reporting that they always use condoms with this client population (Table 45), and mean duration of always using condoms was 2.3 years (Table 46). Highest levels were found among home-based FSWs (89%), those working for 10+ years (86.7%), and devadasis (85.3%). In contrast, brothel-based FSWs as well as those selling sex away from place of interview were less likely to always use condoms with this clientele (51.3% and 52.3%, respectively). Furthermore, 1.5% reported never using condoms; and this was more likely among women identifying with the scheduled caste (3.5%) and FSWs who were separated/widowed/divorced/deserted (2.9%) (Table 45).

Over 90% of FSWs reported condom use with their last new/occasional client. This scenario was less likely among FSWs working in public places (84.2%), those currently married (81%), and those working for less than 5 years (83.8%) (Table 47).

The majority of respondents (80.7%) reported using a condom to prevent HIV transmission and similarly, close to 40% reported condom use to avoid getting other STIs. More than 20% of FSWs reported using a condom because they impose its use (Table 48).

Most recent sex partners (FTFI)

The majority of FSWs reported that their most recent sex partner was a new client (84.2%), followed by repeat clients (5.4%), husband and cohabiting partner (9.4%), and non-commercial partner (1%) (Table 49). A similar distribution was seen among 2nd most recent sex partners (Table 50). As for 3rd most recent repeat clients, fewer new clients (70.2%) and more repeat clients (12.5%) and husbands/cohabiting partners (15.1%) were reported as compared to the most recent and 2nd most recent repeat clients (Table 51).

Condom use with the three most recent partners

The majority of FSWs reported using condoms with their three most recent partners (85.6%, 84.9%, and 81.4%, respectively). Lower levels of condom use were seen among participants who were currently married, younger (less than 34 years of age), and those currently selling sex places away from place of interview (Table 52).

Different FSW sexual partners in the past (FTFI)




Figure 5: Partner types of FSWs (ever had), n=198

As seen in Figure 5, 13.3% of FSW reported only ever having new/occasional paying clients and no other type of partner. Approximately 6% of the total FSWs reported ever having had partners of all partner types – occasional/new clients, repeat clients, non-commercial, and husband/cohabiting.

Condom breakage (FTFI)

Less than 5% of the entire cohort reported experiencing condom breakage in the last month; and was more likely to be reported among literate women and those in the scheduled tribe (10.8% and 9.3%, respectively) (Table 53). Similarly, 5.7% of the respondent with a most recent sex partner reported experiencing a condom breakage with this partner. Approximately 3% was reported among both groups of women with 2nd and 3rd most recent partner (Table 54).

Anal sex (FTFI)

One-fifth of the women with a husband/cohabiting partner reported ever being asked for anal sex; and 17.3% reported ever having had anal sex with this partner. Women who were separated/widowed/divorced/deserted, those in a caste/tribe other scheduled, and those older (35+) were more likely to be asked for and participate in anal sex with their husband/cohabiting partners (rates of ever having anal sex: 42.9%, 28%, and 26.9%, in that order). Also noteworthy, having anal sex was not reported among devadasis and was less likely to be reported by those in sex work for less than 5 years (4.8%), as well as younger women (10.7%) (Table 55).

As for anal sex with the most recent non-commercial (NC) partner (n=57), 31.2% of FSWs reported that they had ever asked for anal sex and 20.6% of those who had NC partners reported they had ever had anal sex with this type of client (Table 56).

Of those with repeat clients (n=95), approximately 44% reported that their most recent repeat client had asked for anal sex at some time; however, 12% reported having had anal sex with this partner type. Women who were aged 25 to 35 years, currently separated/widowed/divorced/deserted, had no other source of income other than sex work, and had been working for 5-9 years were most likely to report having been asked and having had anal sex (51% and 20%; 71% and 23%; 51% and 17%; and 60% and 18%, respectively) (Table 57).

With regard to new/occasional clients, 62.5% reported this client population ever asking for anal sex with a mean number 3.1 clients asking for anal sex per month. Although proposition was high, less than 13% reported ever having had anal sex with these clients. Brothel-based FSWs, those selling sex in places away from place of interview, and those separated/widowed/ divorced/deserted were most likely to have been propositioned and consented to having anal sex (27.5%, 25%, and 22.5%, respectively) (Table 58).

Alcohol use (FTFI)

Alcohol use among FSWs while having sex with clients was considerable with nearly 40% reporting this behavior. Highest reporting was seen among those currently selling sex in places away from place of interview, brothel-based, separated/widowed/divorced/deserted, older FSWs, and those identifying with a caste/tribe other than scheduled (72.1%, 61.3%, 55.4%, 54%, and 51.5%, in that order) (Table 59).

Among clients intoxication during sex with FSWs was extremely high, with 86.8% of the FSWs reporting this behaviour by a client. Clients of brothel-based FSWs, devadasis, women who were of a caste/tribe other than scheduled caste/tribe, and clients of younger FSWs were most likely to be under the influence of alcohol while having sex (100%, 96.6%, 96.2%, and 93%, respectively) (Table 59).

Alcohol use at the time of sex with the *most recent* repeat clients was high with 42.5% reporting drinking with these clients and nearly 80% reporting that their clients did the same (Table 60). Among the respondents with NC sex partners, 49.8% reported being under the influence of alcohol when having sex with the *most recent* NC sex partner. A much higher proportion (79%) reported that their most recent NC sex partner is normally intoxicated during sex (Table 61).

HIV/AIDS knowledge (FTFI)

On average, FSWs had known about HIV/AIDS for 2 years. FSWs who were older, more experienced, scheduled tribe, and literate were most likely to have known about HIV for longer than five years as compared to the average (15.3%, 14.2%, 15.2%, 14.9%, respectively, versus average of 8.7%) (Table 62).

Only 22% of the women felt that they were at risk of being infected with HIV and this was highest among women soliciting in public places (30.0%), scheduled caste women (29.3%), FSWs working for 10 years or more (29.3%), and those who sell sex away from the place of interview (27.5%). Respondents who were younger, brothel-based workers, not in a scheduled caste/tribe, and who lived away from the place of interview felt the least at risk of infection (16.8%, 15.0%, 14.0%, and 13.2%, respectively) (Table 63).

For women who felt at risk of infection (n=54), reasons reported for feeling this way were due to the fact that they were sex workers (84.9%), that they did not use condoms with clients (16.4%), as well that they did not use condoms with all non-client sex partners (6.5%) (Table 64). In contrast, women who did not feel at risk of HIV infection (n=142) reported that they felt this way because of their consistent condom use with all clients and sex partners (75.3%), because they entertained fewer clients than other FSWs (24.9%), their perception that all their sex partners were healthy (16.6%), and because they took injections monthly (9.5%) (Table 65).

Almost two-thirds of respondents (63.7%) reported having taken an HIV/AIDS test. Of the respondents who had taken an HIV test (n=123), those least likely to have taken a test were scheduled caste FSWs (56.3%), brothel-based sex workers (54.6%), those FSWs working for less than 5 years (54.3%), as well as those working for 10 years or more (50.3%) (Table 62). Less than half (42.9%) reported knowing their HIV status; and 67.4% reported having been tested only once. Of the women who had been tested, those least likely to be aware of their HIV status were women who were currently married (27.8%), home-based workers (37.4%), those 25-34 years of age (35.8%), scheduled caste (36.7%), and those with other sources of income (37.5%) (Table 66).

NGO awareness and access (FTFI)

The vast majority of women had been contacted by a peer educator (PE) or NGO worker (94.4%); however, brothel-based workers and those selling sex away from the place of interview were less likely to report contact with a PE/NGO worker (55.4% and 70.2%, respectively) (Table 67). Of respondents who reported they had been contacted by a PE/NGO worker (n=188), the mean duration of contact was one year (Table 68) and they had

been contacted an average of 4.8 times within the month before the survey (Table 69). Approximately 64.4% were contacted <5 times and 28.8% between 5-14 times (Table 69).

Approximately 4% of all the participants reported that they were members of a sex work collective. This was reported mostly by brothel-based FSWs (20.0%), literate women (15.0%), and those selling sex away from the place of interview (17.3%) (Table 70).

Exposure to intervention and condom access (FTFI)

Nearly all (98.9%) the respondents had seen a condom demonstration by a PE or NGO worker (Table 71). Of the women who had seen a condom demonstration within the month before the survey (n=180), the mean number of times they had seen a condom demonstration was 4.3 times (Table 72).

Clinic visits

Of those who were aware of an NGO programme (n=188), 75.8% reported ever having visited an NGO clinic. On average, of those who had ever visited the clinics (n=138), almost all had gone there to see a doctor within the last 3 months and made on average 3.3 visits (Table 73). Of those who visited the clinic, approximately, 18% reported never visiting with symptoms of an STI. Those who did visit for this reason went on average 1.6 times in the previous 3 months (Table 74).

Of those who had ever visited an NGO clinic, 88.1% reported ever receiving a 'grey pack' containing 1g Azithromycin and 400mg Cefiximine for presumptive treatment of chlamydia and gonorrhoea at the clinic. Approximately 45% of the participants who received a grey pack at some time reported receiving one within the last three months 1-3 times and 17.4% reported receiving none (Table 75). Of those who had reported ever receiving a grey pack, the mean number received within the past three months was 2.5 packs.

FTFI and ICVI analysis

As described above, an ICVI study was undertaken in the same area at the same time as the FTFI with different respondents. There were a total of 397 participants - 199 in the ICVI and 198 in the FTFI. There were no significant differences found between the respondents in the two surveys with regard to age, which was approximately 29, and literacy, with nearly 80% of the respondents illiterate. However, a significantly higher proportion of ICVI participants reported starting sex work under the age of 20 (61.3% vs. 40.9% p < 0.001). The mean age of starting sex work for the respondents of the ICVI was 18.9 years and was 21.4 years for the FTFI respondents (Table 76).

Non-commercial partner types did not vary between the respondents in the two surveys. Approximately 60% of the women in both surveys reported having a husband/cohabiting partner. Furthermore, over a quarter of women in both surveys reported having non-paying partners in the past year (other than husband/cohabiting partner) (Table 76).

Reporting risk behaviours

Our hypothesis was that respondents questioned in the more anonymous ICVI would be more likely to report risky sex practices than those questioned in the face to face interviews and less likely to report risk aversion strategies such as condom use. However, the results from

all but one of the questions regarding risk behaviours did not concur with our hypothesis. Over 62% of participants in both the ICVI and FTFI surveys reported having been asked for anal sex by a client of any type (occasional or regular). Similarly, over 17% of participants in both surveys reported ever having had anal sex. However, there was a significant difference seen in the number of clients (both occasional and regular) asking for anal sex per month (5+ clients, ICVI 53.7% vs. FTFI 44.1%, p < 0.001) (Table 77).

Although a greater proportion of ICVI participants reported a higher number of clients on the last working day, this was not statistically significant (5+ clients, 14.5% vs. 9.9%, p=0.109). Furthermore, less than one-fifth of ICVI and FTFI respondents (no difference between the groups) reported that they had ever been beaten or otherwise physically forced to have sexual intercourse within the past year (Table 77).

Reporting risk aversion behaviours: condom use

Eight questions were asked about condom use and condom breakage. Experiencing condom breakage during the month before the survey was more likely to be reported by ICVI respondents than FTFI respondents (8.1% vs. 4.4%, p=0.083) (Table 78).

Six questions were asked specifically about the use of condoms with different partners (Table 78). For the use of a condom during last sex with repeat clients and last anal sex, there was no statistically significant difference in reporting by the two groups of respondents. With regard to condom use at last sex with non-paying partners (other than husband/cohabiting partner), ICVI participants reported statistically significant lower rates of condom use than FTFI participants (48.4% vs. 69.4%, p = 0.01). Unusually, and inexplicably, condom use at last sex with new/occasional clients and with husband/cohabiting partner was more likely to be reported by ICVI participants than by FTFI participants (97.7% vs. 90.7%, p = 0.015; and 75.5% vs. 37.2%, p < 0.001).

Discussion

Overview of study population

The face to face interviews conducted with 198 FSWs in Bellary urban found over half of the cohort worked in home-based settings, followed by 35% soliciting in public places and a minority working in brothel-based settings. The average age of respondents was 29 years, with youngest FSWs being brothel-based. The majority was found to be illiterate and once married, but currently separated, widowed, divorced, or deserted. Sexual debut averaged 15 years and mean age to start sex work was 21 years. Additionally, participants had worked as sex workers for an average of seven years. Nearly half the participants were dependent on sex work for their livelihood, sold sex for an average of sixteen days per month and had about three clients per day worked. Vaginal sex was reported to be the predominant type of sex sold.

Exposure to intervention

Despite the fact that the *Avahan* HIV prevention programme had only recently started at the time of the face to face interviews, the study found exposure to the NGO intervention in Bellary to be quite high. Nearly all of the women had been contacted by a peer educator or NGO worker and had been in contact for one year on average. Likewise, virtually all the respondents had witnessed a condom demonstration by a PE or NGO worker and were aware of the NGO programme. Of the women who were aware of the NGO programme, over three-quarters had visited an NGO STI clinic and had made an average of three visits to the clinic to see a doctor within the three months prior to the interview. The majority of women who had visited a STI clinic reported having received a grey pack at the clinic. Given that over a fifth of the women felt that they were at risk of being infected with HIV, it was encouraging to find that more than two-thirds of respondents reported testing for HIV; however, it would have been better to have more than 43% of FSWs reporting awareness of their HIV status.

Community mobilisation, collectivisation, and empowerment have been identified as key components to successful HIV prevention programmes [8-11]. Among the FSWs of the Bellary programme, there was little evidence of collectivization among FSWs given that only 4% of the participants reported membership in a sex work collective.

Moderate rates of condom use with clients and non-cohabiting partners

Reported condom use among women with repeat clients and new/occasional clients was relatively high with approximately three-quarters of these women reporting always using condoms with their respective clients. The majority of them said they used condoms to prevent HIV transmission and to avoid getting other STIs.

A moderate level of condom use was found among women with non-commercial partners, where approximately half reported always using a condom with this partner. However, over 30% reported not using a condom with their most recent non-commercial partner. This is of concern as nearly 80% of these women reported that their most recent NC partner also had

sexual relationships with other women. Nearly half of the women using a condom with this partner said that they used it because their partner was aware that she was a sex worker.

Low rates of condom use with husbands or cohabiting partners and sexual mixing

Over half of the FSWs with a husband or cohabiting partner reported never using condoms with this man and less than 15% reported always using a condom. In contrast to the reasons for not using condoms with other partner types, the most common reason reported for not using a condom with a husband/cohabiting partner was his lack of cooperation. To make matters worse, over 60% of the married/cohabiting women were aware that their regular partner also had sexual relationships with other women. Thus, there seem to be significant levels of sexual mixing between FSWs, their husbands/cohabiting partners, non-commercial sex partners, and the additional female partners of both groups of men. Many studies have shown that negotiation of condom use with regular partners (i.e. husbands or lovers) can be difficult given that issues of trust and intimacy arise [12-13]. This complex interplay of limited condom use/lack of cooperation, high levels of sexual mixing, and potential issues of mistrust suggests that substantial risk for HIV/STI acquisition and transmission continues to exist among FSWs in Bellary despite the relatively high rates of reported condom use with their clients.

Brothel-based FSWs and increased risk factors

We observed some characteristics of brothel-based FSWs in Bellary that suggest increased levels of risk for HIV/STI acquisition and transmission. In particular, these FSWs were more likely to live away from the place of interview (but within Bellary district) and to sell sex away from the place of interview. In addition, all brothel-based sex workers in this study reported complete dependency on sex work for their livelihood. Furthermore, brothel-based women worked, on average, ten days more and had approximately 6 more clients each month than the overall cohort. Additionally, violence within the past year was more likely to be reported by brothel-based sex workers than other types of sex workers. Finally, with regard to intervention exposure, brothel-based FSWs were the least likely to report contact with a PE/NGO worker. Although there was a small sample of brothel-based workers in this study (n=26) indicating a need to interpret these findings with caution, further investigation is required to determine the level of vulnerability among brothel-based FSWs and to ascertain if further targeted outreach is needed for these women.

Anal sex

Relatively high rates of being propositioned for anal sex and having anal sex were found among FSWs in Bellary district, compared to other districts in Karnataka [14-16]. Approximately 20% to 30% of women with regular and non-commercial sex partners had been asked for anal sex, with 17% to 20% consenting to anal sex with them at some point in time. With regard to clients, approximately 44% reported that their most recent repeat client had asked for anal sex at some time; however, 12% reported having had anal sex with him. Although the respondents reported a high number of requests for anal sex by new/occasional clients (63%), a similar proportion of women reported having had anal sex with these partners (13%) as they did with most recent repeat clients. Women who were separated/widowed/divorced/deserted, women who had no other source of income, as well as brothel-based FSWs were most likely to have been propositioned and ultimately consented to

having anal sex with all partner types. Thus, targeted interventions around anal sex and condom use at each instance of anal sex would be valuable given the relatively high rates of anal sex found among FSWs in Bellary.

Alcohol use and violence

Alcohol use during sex with all partner types was prevalent among the FTFI participants, ranging from nearly 40% to 50% of the time. In particular, higher rates of intoxication with clients was most likely among FSWs currently selling sex in places away from the place of interview, among brothel-based FSWs, and among older women, particularly those who were separated/widowed/divorced/deserted. Data from qualitative studies from a district in Andra Pradesh suggests that a complex interplay of violence, poverty, and shame contribute to feelings of depression and hopelessness that might lead to high rates of alcohol use [13]. Furthermore, elevated levels of alcohol use may negatively impact on the ability or desire to negotiate condom use with partners [13, 17].

To further complicate matters, approximately one-fifth of the participants reported that they had been beaten or otherwise physically forced to have sexual intercourse within the past year, with brothel-based sex workers most likely to report this situation. This evidence stresses the need not only to focus on interventions that provide support and means to empowerment, but also interventions that address the larger societal and structural factors which contribute to the vulnerability and marginalization of FSWs.

Study limitations

The primary limitation of this study is related to the cross-sectional design of the surveys. This type of design merely provides a single time-point view of FSWs characteristics and behaviours. Without an accompanying baseline survey, continued comparison of behaviour over time cannot be made. Additional issues with establishing temporality and casual inference between exposure to programme intervention and outcome (e.g. condom use) also arise. Also, the inherent shortcoming of not having a control group could cause concern that the findings in the study are due to chance, independent of the intervention programme.

Furthermore, the lack of biological evidence eliminates the possibility of examining associations between reported behaviour – subject to varying biases – and the HIV/STI rates. With regard to sample size, the relatively small sample sizes for stratified characteristics, for example, FSWs with repeat clients (n=95), those with non-commercial clients (n=57), and brothel based workers (n=26) also raises concern for standard error due to the random or sampling variation, and ultimately the generalizability of women in these stratified groups for the overall population of these FSWs in Bellary. Reliability of self-reporting is also a critical issue in this study. Given that many question asked about past history of behaviour and exposure, for example the frequency of condom use among different partner types, recall bias and social desirability bias are also likely occur.

Respondents likely give socially desirable responses to questions that focus on more risky sexual behaviours, like anal sex, and risk aversion strategies such as condom use. Through the ICVI and FTFI comparison we attempted to measure levels of social desirability. However, for some of the questions compared, the results did not match our hypothesis that

respondents questioned in the more anonymous ICVI would be more likely to report risky sex practices than those questioned in the face to face interviews and less likely to report risk aversion strategies such as condom use. In particular, the comparison of data on condom use at last sex with husband/cohabiting partners, occasional clients, as well as condom use with the last client produced results that were counter to our hypothesis. These unusual results may have been due to errors in administration of the interview, data entry, or simply a misunderstanding of the questions themselves.

Finally, the intervention exposure and condom use measurements in this study do not fully capture all of the nuances of HIV risk reduction. Self-esteem and empowerment are critical outcomes and are thought to be pre-cursors of behaviour change, but these are not adequately measured here. Thus, further qualitative studies are needed to provide better understanding of how empowerment, as well as violence, mental health, and stigma contribute to risk reduction.

Conclusion

The findings in this study clearly suggest that the HIV intervention programme in Bellary was, at the end of 2005, 14 months after then start of the *Avahan* HIV prevention programme, already having a significant impact on the FSWs in terms of condom use with clients and in accessing sexual health services. However, given that there were relatively low rates of condom use with husbands/cohabiting partners, elevated levels of alcohol use, as well as evidence of sexual mixing, it is clear that further efforts were at that time necessary to facilitate behaviour change among FSWs. Although early signs of collectivization and empowerment were seen among the FSWs in Bellary, the study suggests but the need to expand this and to address the larger socio-economic factors that contribute to the vulnerability and marginalization of FSWs.

Appendix I: Sample Weights and Design

Sample weights

The basic sample design used in IBBA is a two-stage design. The first stage consisted of the selection of clusters and the second stage consisted of selection of certain number of FSWs from each selected cluster. While this design greatly enhanced the feasibility of data collection, it resulted in differential probabilities of selection; consequently each FSW covered in IBBA does not necessarily represent the same number of FSWs in the population, as would be the case if a simple random sampling approach were employed. To account for differential probabilities of selection due to the nature of the design and to ensure accurate survey estimates, IBBA computed a sampling weight for each FSW that participated in the survey.

The general weighting procedure for IBBA required two steps. The first step consisted of calculating a cluster weight. A cluster-level non-response adjustment was applied to the cluster weight; it was calculated independently for each design domain (type of sex work site).

The second step consisted of calculating a FSW weight. A FSW-level non-response adjustment was applied to the FSW weight. The FSW weight was calculated independently for each sampled cluster.

The overall sampling weight attached to each FSW record is the product of the two intermediate weights: the first stage (cluster) weight, and the second stage (FSW) weight.

The first stage weight represents the inverse of the first stage selection probability assigned to a sampled

Since the clusters in the first stage are selected with equal probabilities, the first stage weight for the selected cluster was based on design weights adjusted for the effect of different non-response in each sampling domain: Home-based and street-based sites. Let CRi be the proportion of the selected sites where IBBA could be conducted. The sample weight for the domain dw_i is calculated as:

$$dw_i = \frac{dw_{Di}}{DR_i}$$

where w_{Di} = the design weight for the i^{th} domain, calculated as the ratio of overall sampling fraction (F = n/N) and the sampling fraction for the i^{th} domain (f = n_i/N_i). Note that n = $\sum n_i$ and N = \sum_{N_i} . Ri is the proportion of the clusters where IBBA could be carried out.

The cluster sample weight is adjusted for cluster-level non-response (clusters where IBBA could not be carried out).

The FSW weights were calculated for each cluster selected. The sample weight for each cluster cw_i is calculated as:

$$cw_i = \frac{cw_{Ci}}{CR_i}$$

where c_{Di} = the design weight for the i^{th} cluster, calculated as the ratio of overall sampling fraction (F = n/N) and the sampling fraction for the i^{th} cluster (f = n_i/N_i). Note that n = \sum n_i i.e., the number of FSWs selected from cluster i, and N = \sum N_i, i.e., the number of FSWs enumerated in cluster i.

Ri is the proportion of FSWs selected, who gave the interview plus blood sample plus urine sample.

The final weights (cluster weight multiplied by FSW weight) are normalized so that the total number of weighted cases is equal to the total number of unweighted cases.

Weights in a Time Location Cluster (TLC) sample design

The sex workers soliciting in brothel or home based set up are assumed to be stable over the IBBA field work period. However, those in the public places often are not the same over the different days of a week or at different time-segments of a day. This could be either because they tend to solicit in specified times or days or because they move from one site to another at different time points. When the sample respondents are mobile and are expected to be available for recruitment at different sites and since the number vary at different point of time in a day, selection of a Time Location Cluster (TLC) as the first sampling unit provide a better design.

Conventionally, while selecting TLCs as the first sampling unit, the domain sample fraction for the TLCs is n/N_1 , where n be the number of TLCs to be selected and N_1 be the total number of TLCs in the sampling frame. The sampling fraction heavily depends on the number of TLCs in a day and duration of the survey. Higher the duration of the survey, the number of TLCs would be higher and hence lower the sampling fraction. This assumes mutually exclusive and independent clusters, which may not always be true in reality. The respondents in any TLCs often solicit in other TLCs as well, particularly TLCs of that site itself.

The conventional weighting does not give true weights in such sampling design. If information on mobility of sex workers between TLCs within a site or between sites is/are available, we could account this in the domain fraction. However, it is difficult for surveys to capture such information.

Hence, we assume that mobility between sites is negligible and random selection of TLCs ensures to capture any variation in the number of sex workers across TLCs of a site. Then, if all the public place sites in the frame are divided into equal number of TLCs, the domain sampling fraction will be; n/N, where n is the number of clusters to be selected and N is the total number of public place sites in the frame.

The sites could be divided into equal or unequal number of TLCs based on the peak /lean time/day. The sampling fraction would be different depending on how the sites are divided in the TLCs.

Equal number of TLCs

If the sites are divided into equal number of TLCs, each site in the sampling frame has an equal probability of selection. Then, the sampling fraction for selection of TLCs would be the same as the sampling fraction of selecting a site. Let n be the number of TLCs to be selected and N be the number of sites in the sample frame, then the sampling fraction of selecting a TLCs to be n/N.

Unequal number of TLCs

When the sites are divided into TLCs based on the peak/lean day/time, then the number of TLCs in each site vary depending on the operation of the sites. In such situation, the sites with higher number of TLCs often have a higher probability of selection as compared to sites with less number of TLCs.

Once again assuming that the mobility between sites are more or less same across the TLCs or are negligible, the sampling fraction of selecting a TLC is:

$$ni*mi/N_1$$

Where ni be the number of TLCs to be selected, mi be the mean number of TLCs of the selected clusters and N_I be the total number of TLCs in the sampling frame.

Adjusted overall sampling fraction

While adopting a sampling design with TLCs, overall sampling fraction will be adjusted if the design has an unequal number of TLCs in sites. Each brothel or home based sites has an equal probability of being included in the sample, whereas the probability of public place sites to be different and depend on the number of TLCs in each site. A site with higher number of TLCs would have a higher probability, while those with fewer TLCs would have lower probability of selection.


Since each site has a different probability, the overall probability is being derived using a correction factor. The correction factor is derived using the mean number of TLCs of selected sites versus overall. Let *M* be the mean number of TLCs in a site and let *m* be the mean number of TLCs of selected sites, then the correction factor is:

$$pi=M/mi$$

If n_i is the number of sites in ith domain and pi be the correction factor for the domain (p_i for brothel and home based sites to be 1), then the overall correction factor is;

 $\Sigma n_i * p_i / Nt$ where N_t is the total number of sites in the sampling frame.

Multiplying the weight (sampling fraction) with the correction factor will give the corrected weight at the overall level.
