
2. Project objectives

- 2.1. General objective
- To restrain HIV/AIDS epidemic within IDU and from this group in to community in Lamg Son
- 2.2. Specific objectives
- 2.2.1. Reduce risk of used-syringe related HIV infection from 60% of the present number of IDU (who inject drug with syringe used by other) down to 30% stably;
- 2.2.2. Reduce risk of HIV infection via used syringe distribution from 60% of IDU (who give used syringe to other) down to 30% stably;
- 2.2.3. Reduce unsafe sex practic among IDU significally;
- 2.2.4. Collect and proper dispose used syringe with the goals of 75.000 used syringe/year;
- 2.2.5. Support 100 IDU post drug treatment and rehabilitation based on group activities with the peer support to help at least 30% of IDU not to use drug or shifting from injection to inhale or smocking within 01 year;
- 2.2.6. Vocational training and occupational support for 40 peers and IDU;
- 2.2.7. Supply social and medical support service to IDU who HIV (+) in all project sites.
