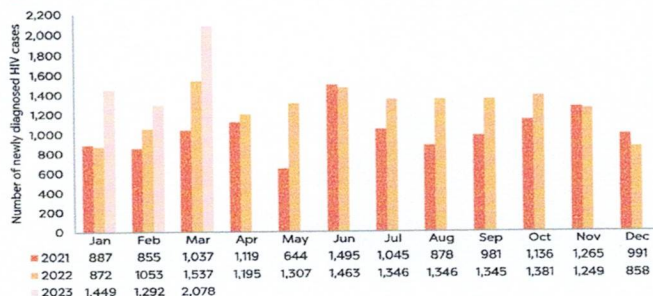

## NEWLY DIAGNOSED CASES

In March 2023, there were 2,078 confirmed HIV-positive individuals reported to the HIV/AIDS & ART Registry of the Philippines (HARP)<sup>2</sup> [Figure 1], of which, 498 (24%) had clinical manifestations of advanced HIV infection<sup>3,4</sup> at the time of diagnosis [Table 1]. This was a 35% increase compared to the same reporting period last year [Figure 1]. Moreover, there were 770 (37%) cases reported this month that were supposed to be confirmed from the previous months.

Majority (95%) of the total reported cases in March 2023 were male while 97 (5%) were female. The age of the reported cases ranged from 1 to 71 years old (median: 28 years). Further, among the newly diagnosed cases, 1,006 (48%) were 25-34 years old, 635 (31%) were 15-24 years old, 383 (19%) were 35-49 years old, 46 (2%) were 50 years and older, and eight (<1%) were less than 15 years old<sup>5</sup>.

Moreover, there were 10 HIV-positive women aged 18 to 42 years old who were pregnant at the time of diagnosis.

Sexual contact remained to be the predominant mode of transmission (2,025, 97%) while transmission through sharing of infected needles accounted for 19 cases (1%), eight (<1%) were children who acquired HIV through mother-to-child transmission, and the remaining 26 (1%) had no data on MOT this reporting period. Among the newly reported cases who acquired HIV through sexual

contact, 1,478 (73%) males reported history of sex with another male, 343 (17%) had sex with both males and females<sup>10</sup>, while 204 (10%) through an opposite sex.

More than half (1,195, 58%) of the total cases reported in March 2023 were from the National Capital Region [NCR], CaLaBaRZon [4A], and Central Visayas [7] [Figure 2].

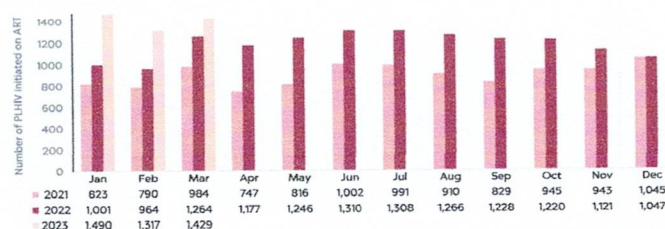


## Anti-retroviral Therapy

In March 2023, there were 1,429<sup>12</sup> people with HIV who were enrolled to treatment [Figure 3], of which, 1,425 were on the first line regimen, one was on second line regimen, and three were on other line of regimen. Among them, 671 (47%) were 25-34 years old, 460 (32%) were 15-24 years old, 258 (18%) were 35-49 years old, 38 (3%) were 50 years old and older, and two (<1%) were less than 15 years old<sup>5</sup>. The median CD4<sup>13</sup> of these patients upon enrollment was at 225 cells/mm<sup>3</sup>.

A total of 67,194 people living with HIV (PLHIV) were presently on ART as of March 2023, of which, 65,190 (97%) were on the first line regimen, 1,211 (2%) were on the second line, and 796 (1%) were on other line of regimen. The age of reported cases ranged from 1 to 81 years old (median: 32 years old).

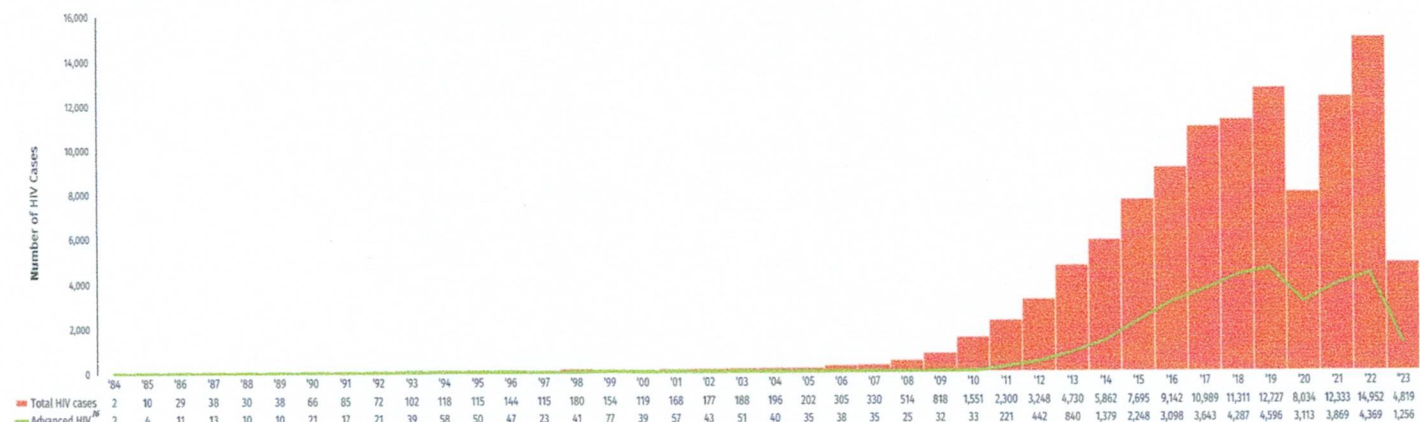

### EPIDEMIC TRENDS OF HIV/AIDS IN THE PHILIPPINES, JAN 1984 - MAR 2023

Since the first reported HIV case in the Philippines in 1984, there have been 114,008 confirmed HIV cases reported to HARP. Of those diagnosed, 107,552 (94%) were male and 6,445 (6%) were female<sup>14</sup>. At the time of diagnosis, more than half (57,621, 51%) were 25-34 years old, 33,182 (29%) were among youth aged 15-24 years old, 19,818 (17%) were 35-49 years old, 2,970 (3%) were 50 years old and above, and 344 (<1%) were less than 15 years of age<sup>15</sup>. The age of diagnosed cases ranged from one month to 81 years old (median: 28 years). Among the reported cases, 34,233 (30%) had advanced clinical manifestation at the time of diagnosis<sup>16</sup>. Ninety percent (102,594 of 114,008) of the total reported cases were reported in the past 10 years, thus showing a significant increase among reported cases when compared to the previous 10-year period (2003 - 2012). 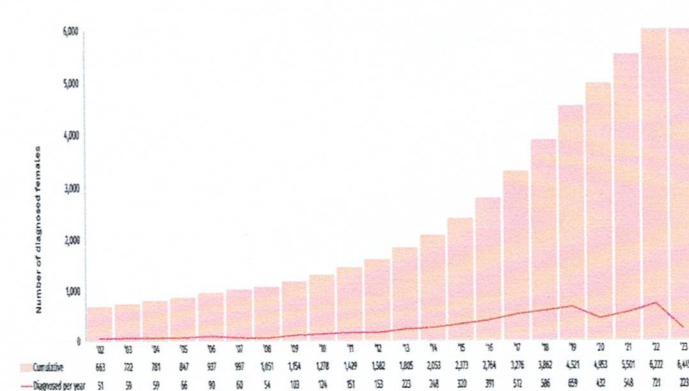
**Figure 4:** Number of diagnosed HIV cases and advanced infections reported in the Philippines by year<sup>17</sup>, Jan 1984-Mar 2023 (N=114,008)



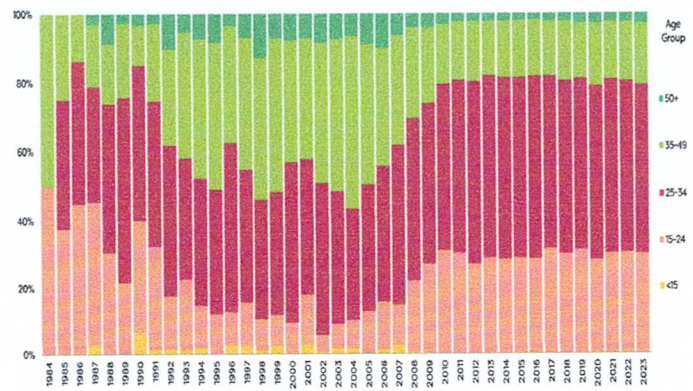
### Sex and Age

The number of newly diagnosed female HIV cases increased by 52% in the first quarter of 2023 with 223 cases compared to 147 cases reported in the same period in 2022 [Figure 5]. Since 2010, the number of newly diagnosed male HIV cases was more than 90% of the total cases per year. Among age groups, the highest increase in the proportion of cases from 2013 - 2023 were among 15 - 24 years old followed by those aged 25-34 years old. Consequently, more than 90% of the total reported cases among these age groups – 30,417 (92%) of total cases among 15 - 24 years old and 52,176 (91%) among 25 - 34 years old were reported in the past 10 years [Figure 6].

### Geographic Distribution

From January 1984 to March 2023, the regions with the most number of reported cases were NCR, followed by CaLaBaRZON [4A], Central Luzon [3], Central Visayas [7], and Western Visayas [6], altogether accounting for 86,001 (75%) of the total reported cases. Further, 26,915 (24%) were from the rest of the country while 1,091 (1%) had no data on region of residence [Table 2]. Moreover, one (<1%) case reported Overseas as permanent residence.

### Mode of Transmission (MOT)

As of March 2023, sexual contact among males who have sex with males (MSM) (93,731, 82%) remains the predominant MOT among the total reported cases, followed by male-female sex (16,048, 14%), and sharing of infected needles (2,504, 2%). More than half of males who acquired HIV through sex with males (48,563, 52%) were 25-34 years old. Among diagnosed females, majority (6,013, 93%) acquired HIV through sexual contact and 149 (2%) through sharing of infected needles [Table 3].

From 1984 to 2006, the predominant MOT was sexual contact between male and female, however, in 2007, the trend shifted to sexual contact among MSM and remained as such up to the present. Further, while the proportion of HIV cases acquired through sharing of needles was highest in 2010 accounting for 9% of 1,551 cases reported that year, it has been decreasing since 2011 and remained at 1% among newly diagnosed cases in the past 5 years.

MOT varies across the Regions – 34,189 (36%) of diagnosed males who have sex with males were from NCR; more than half of those who have acquired HIV through mother-to-child transmission were from NCR, Region 4A, and Region 3 (169, 57%); and almost all (2,497, >99%) reported intravenous transmission (people who inject drugs) were from Region 7.

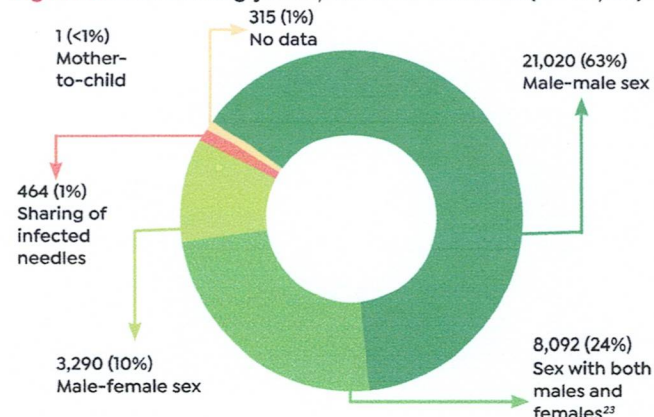
### SPECIFIC POPULATION

#### Youth (15-24 years old)

In March 2023, 635 (31%) cases were youth aged 15-24 years old, among which 610 (96%) were male and 25 (4%) were female. Six hundred twenty-eight (99%) cases were infected through sexual contact (503 male had history of sex with another male, 85 through sex with both males & females<sup>23</sup>, and 40 had male-female sex), two (<1%) were infected through sharing of infected needles, and five cases (1%) had no data on MOT.

From January 1984 to March 2023, 33,182 (29%) of the reported cases were 15-24 years old. Among the youth cases, 32,402 (98%) were infected through sexual contact (21,020 males had history of sex with another male, 8,092 through sex with both males & females<sup>23</sup>, and 3,290 had male-female sex), 464 (1%) were infected through sharing of infected needles, one (<1%) was infected through mother-to-child transmission, and 315 (1%) had no data on MOT [Figure 7]. More males were diagnosed among the youth since 2004, however, the number of diagnosed HIV cases among female youth increased in the past 10 years. From 493 female youth HIV cases reported from 2013 to 2017, the number of newly diagnosed female youth increased by 91% from 2018 to 2023 (944).

**Figure 7: MOT among youth, Jan 1984-Mar 2023 (n = 33,182)<sup>24</sup>**



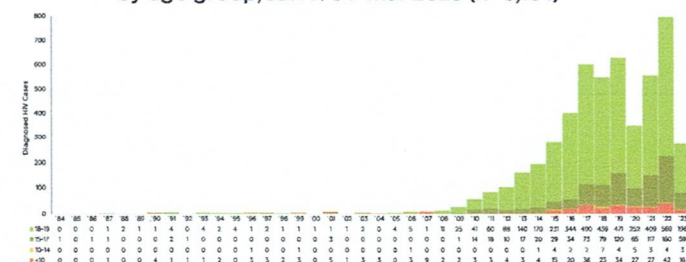
#### Children (<10) & Adolescents (10-19)

In March 2023, there were 132 newly reported cases aged 19 and below, of which, 125 were adolescents aged 10 - 19 years old and seven were children less than 10 years old. Among the adolescents, one was 10 years old, 30 were 15-17 years old, and 94 were 18-19 years old at the time of diagnosis. Almost all (23, 98%) of the newly reported adolescent cases were infected through sexual contact (103 males had history of sex with another male, 10 through male-female sex, and 10 through sex with both male and female)<sup>23</sup>, one (1%) through sharing of infected needles, and one (1%) through mother-to-child transmission. On the other hand, all newly diagnosed children acquired HIV through mother-to-child transmission.

Among the diagnosed cases from January 1984 to March 2023, 5,164 (5%) were 19 years old or younger at the time of diagnosis, of which, 306 (6%) were less than 10 years old, 38 (1%) were 10-14 years old, 845 (16%) were 15-17 years old, and 3,975 (77%) were 18-19 years old [Figure 8].

Following the ratification of the Philippine HIV and AIDS Policy Act (RA 11166) where the age for HIV testing without the need for consent from parent or guardian was lowered to 15 years, the number of reported cases among 15-17 years old has increased by 78% from 2019-2023 compared to 304 total cases reported aged 15 - 17 years old before the ratification in 2018. Among the 52,865 newly reported cases from 2019 - 2023, 541 (1%) were 15 - 17 years old and 1,897 (4%) were 18 - 19 years old at the time of diagnosis.

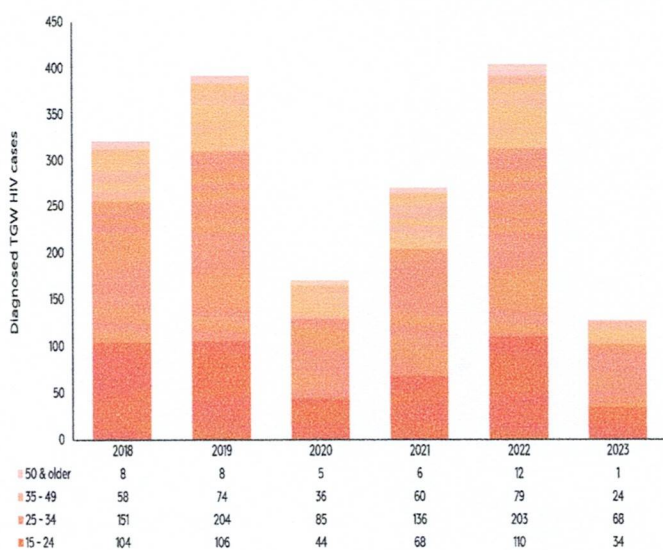
## Transgender Women (TGW)

Of the total reported cases for March 2023, 1,269 (61%) were cisgender<sup>25</sup>, 42 (2%) were transgender women, 20 (1%) comprise other gender identities, four (<1%) identified their gender neither as man nor woman, and 742 (36%) have unknown/no data on gender identity. Among the transgender women, 20 (48%) were 25 - 34 years old, 17 (40%) were 15 - 24 years old, and five (12%) were 35-49 years old<sup>26</sup>. The age of diagnosis ranged from 17 to 44 years old (median: 27 years).

Of the 1,685 TGW diagnosed from January 2018<sup>27</sup> to March 2023, 1,669 (99%) acquired HIV through sexual contact, four (<1%) through sharing of infected needles, and 12 (1%) had no data on MOT<sup>26</sup>.

Further, half (847, 50%) of the TGW were 25-34 years old at the time of diagnosis, 466 (28%) were 15-24 years old, 331 (20%) were 35-49 years old, and 40 (2%) were 50 years and older, and one had no data on age [Figure 9]. The age of diagnosis ranged from 15 to 63 years old (median: 28 years).

## Overseas Filipino Workers (OFW)

Ninety - six (5%) of the newly reported cases in March 2023 were Filipinos who worked overseas within the past five years, whether on land or at sea. Among them, 86 (90%) were male and 10 (10%) were female. Of the male OFW cases, 84 (98%) acquired HIV through sexual contact (54 males had history of sex with another male, 17 through sex with both males and females<sup>30</sup>, and 13 through male-female sex) and two had no data on MOT. The age of male OFWs ranged from 24 to 57 years old (median: 33 years). Meanwhile, all the female OFWs were infected through sexual contact. The age of the reported female OFW ranged from 25 to 42 years old (median: 35 years).

From January 1984 to March 2023, 9,340 (8%) of the total cases were OFWs. Of these, 8,227 (88%) were male and 1,113 (12%) were female. Among the male cases, 8,096 (98%) were infected through sexual contact (3,814 had history of sex with another male, 2,450 through sex with both males and females<sup>30</sup>, and 1,832 through male-female

## Transactional Sex

People who engage in transactional sex are those who reported that they either pay for sex, regularly accept payment for sex, or do both. Reporting of transactional sex was included in the HARP starting December 2012.

In March 2023, 223 (11%) of the newly diagnosed engaged in transactional sex within the past 12 months [Table 4]. Two hundred seventeen (97%) were male and six (3%) were female. Their age ranged from 16 to 71 years old (median: 29 years). Of the male cases, 88 (41%) reported paying for sex only, 72 (33%) reported accepting payment for sex only, and 57 (26%) engaged in both. On the other hand, two (33%) of the female cases reported paying for sex only, three (50%) accepted payment for sex, and one (17%) engaged in both.

A total of 12,303 cases reported to HARP from December 2012 to March 2023 engaged in transactional sex<sup>29</sup>. Majority (11,935, 97%) were male and 368 (3%) were female. There were 6,475 (53%) who paid for sex, 3,944 (32%) who accepted payment for sex, and 1,884 (15%) who engaged in both [Table 4].

sex), 17 (<1%) through sharing of infected needles, four (<1%) through other MOT, while 110 (1%) had no data on MOT. The ages of male OFWs ranged from 16 to 80 years old (median: 32 years).

Among female OFWs, 1,085 (97%) were infected through sexual contact, eight (1%) through other MOT, one through sharing of infected needles, and 19 (2%) had no data on MOT. The age of female OFWs ranged from 20 to 73 years old (median: 35 years).

The regions with the most number of OFW reported to HARP were NCR with 2,771 (30%) cases, Region 4A with 1,702 (18%) cases, and Region 3 with 1,189 (13%) cases. Further, 3,412 (37%) cases were from other regions and 265 (3%) had no data on region of residence<sup>26</sup>.

## Pregnant Women with HIV

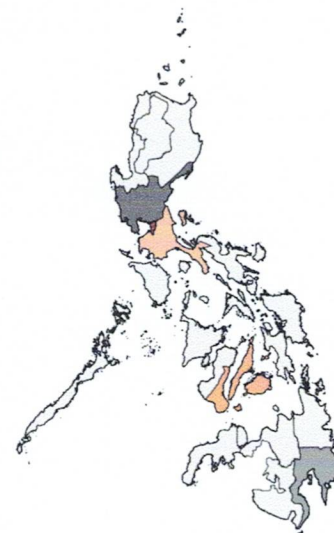
Reporting of pregnancy status at the time of diagnosis was included in HARP since 2011.

From January to March 2023, there were 22 HIV positive women who were pregnant at the time of diagnosis. This was a 24% decrease compared to the same reporting period last year (29). Of the reported pregnant women with HIV from January to March 2023, six (27%) were from NCR, four (18%) each were reported from CaLaBaRZon [4A] and Central Visayas [7], three (14%) were from Central Luzon [3], and one (5%) cases each from Regions 1,12, 4B, 5, and 6<sup>31</sup>. The age of diagnosis ranged from 18 to 42 years old (median: 26 years).

Since 2011, a total of 740 diagnosed women were reported pregnant at the time of diagnosis. The regions with highest number of diagnosed pregnant cases with HIV were NCR (309, 42%), Regions 7 (117, 16%), 4A (107, 14%), 3 (76, 10%), and 11 (23, 3%).

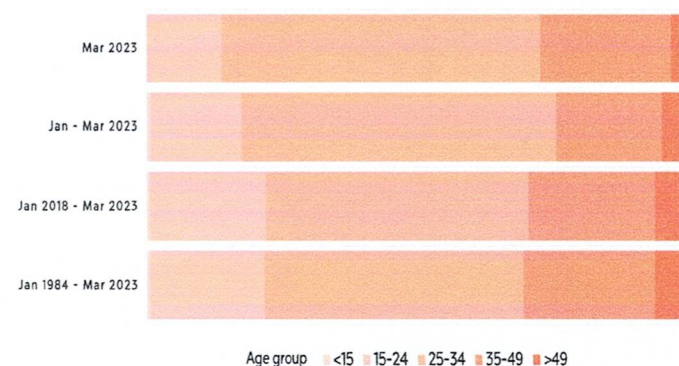


## Mortality

In March 2023, there were 57<sup>32,33</sup> reported deaths due to any cause among people with HIV, of which, 54 (95%) were males. Thirty-four (60%) were 25-34 years old, 14 (25%) were 35-49 years old, eight (14%) were 15-24 years old, and one (2%) was 54 years old [Figure 11]. Nearly half (46%) of the newly reported deaths were from CaLaBaRZon [4A], NCR, and Central Luzon [3] [Table 5].

A total of 6,474 deaths were reported from January 1984 to March 2023 and 5,996 (93%) were male. Among different age groups, the largest proportion of reported deaths were among the 25-34 years old accounting for 3,137 (48%) of total deaths followed by 35-49 years old with 1,595 (25%), 15-24 years old with 1,380 (21%), 50 years old and older with 317 (5%), and <15 years old with 41 (1%). Four (<1%) of the reported deaths had no reported age at the time of death. Meanwhile, the top 5 regions with the most number of reported deaths were NCR, 4A, 3, 6, and 7 [Table 5].

### HIV/AIDS & ART REGISTRY OF THE PHILIPPINES

The HARP is the official record of total number of diagnoses (laboratory-confirmed), ART outcome status and deaths among people with HIV in the Philippines. All individuals in the registry are confirmed by the San Lazaro Hospital STD/AIDS Cooperative Central Laboratory (SACCL) which is the HIV/AIDS National Reference Laboratory (NRL) and DOH Certified Rapid HIV Diagnostic Algorithm - HIV-1s Confirmatory Laboratories (C/CLs). Confirmed HIV positive individuals were reported to the DOH-Epidemiology Bureau (EB) and recorded to HARP. ART figures are counts of HIV positive adult and pediatric patients currently enrolled and accessing Antiretroviral (ARV) medication during the reporting period in 170 treatment hubs and primary HIV care treatment facilities that had reported in the HARP. This report did not include patients who have previously taken ARV but have died, left the country, have been lost to follow-up and/or opted not to take ARV. Lost to follow-up is considered once a person have failed to visit a treatment facility more than 3 months after the expected date of ARV refill.

HARP is a passive surveillance system. Except for HIV confirmation by the NRL & C/CLs, all other data submitted to the HARP are secondary and cannot be verified. Hence, HARP cannot determine if an individual's reported place of residence is where the person got infected, or where the person lived after being infected, or where the person is presently living. This limitation has major implications on data interpretation. Readers are advised to interpret the data with caution and consider other sources of information before arriving at conclusions.
