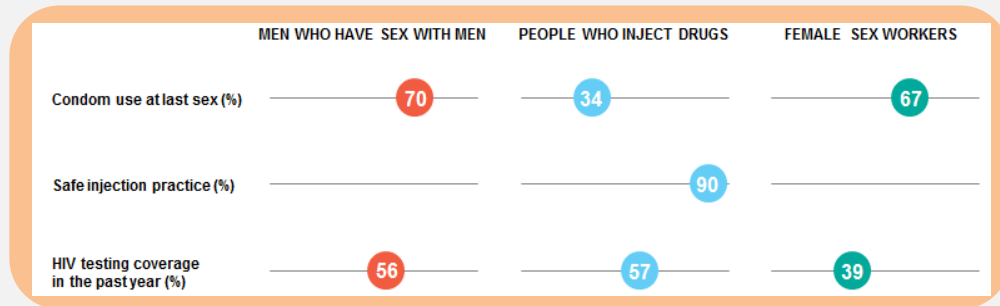


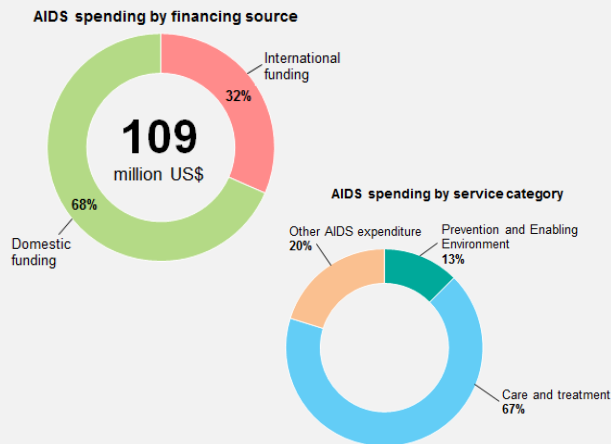
In 2020 nationally only **17%** of all pregnant women living with HIV received antiretroviral medicines for preventing mother-to-child transmission. In Jakarta, the coverage was even lower (**12%**).

## AIDS Financing (2018)



### DOMESTIC FUNDING

Latest available data indicates that **US\$ 580 thousand** was coming from APBD (local budget) in **DKI Jakarta** on HIV-related services in 2018.

Funding for CSOs except via international development partners remains limited. However, there is a new regulation from National Public Procurement Agency (LKPP) (No 8 2018) regarding CSOs accessing domestic funding through Social Contracting. Under this scheme, CSOs/NGOs become a formal partner of the GoI in the implementation of programs at all levels (national down to the district).

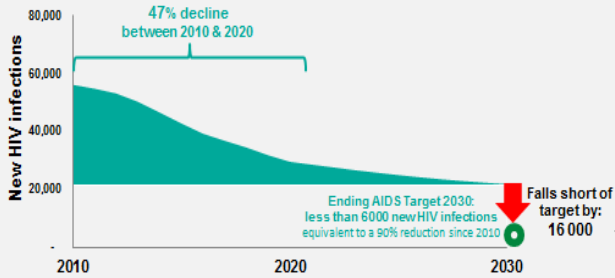
# HIV AIDS FACT SHEET: INDONESIA & JAKARTA

UNAIDS is leading the global effort to end AIDS as a public health threat by 2030 as part of the Sustainable Development Goals. Strong partnership among the United Nations on HIV is also helping to support the accelerated efforts in Indonesia. Advocating for the alignment of the national AIDS response to the Fast Track strategy, the Joint Team on AIDS provided support to reach key populations in Indonesia, to generate evidence to inform country programming and to integrate HIV-related services into the Universal Health Coverage (UHC) scheme.

New HIV infections trend in Indonesia, 2010-2030

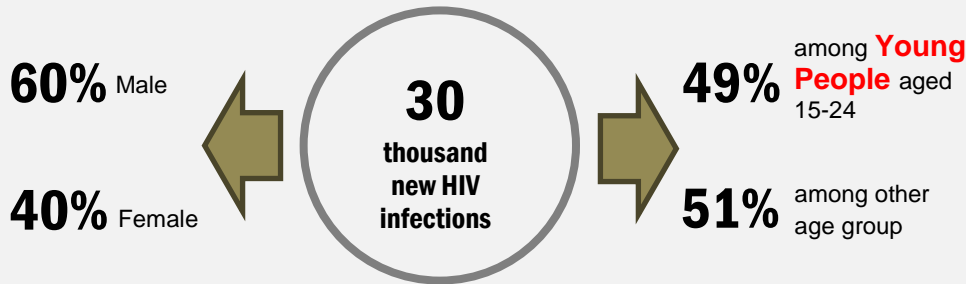

New HIV Infections in Indonesia by Sex and by Age, 2020

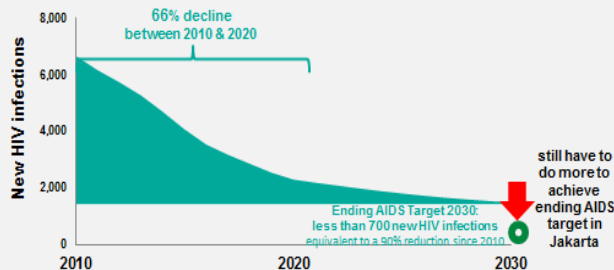

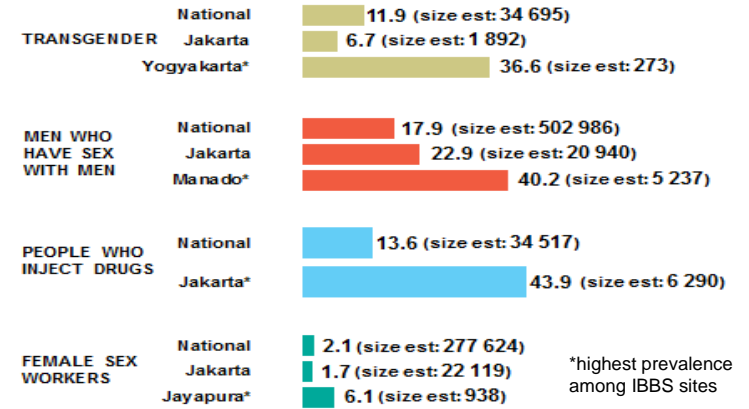

# HIV Prevalence (%) and KP Size Est.

Nationally, HIV prevalence among adults 15+ is estimated at **0.26%** in 2020. Apart from the Papua provinces, HIV epidemic in Indonesia is concentrated among key populations.

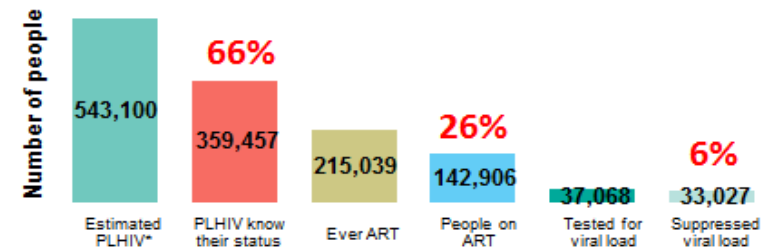

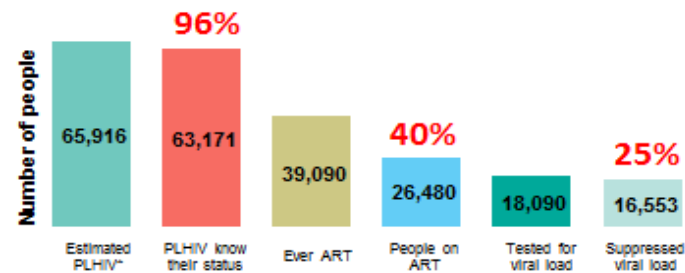


# Treatment Cascade
