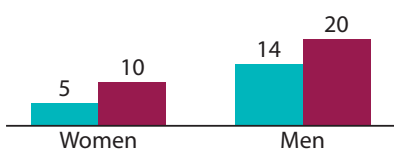

Percent of women and men age 15-49 who were ever tested for HIV and received their results

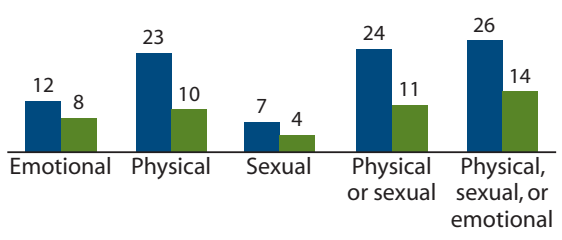

Percent of ever-married women who have experienced the following types of spousal violence

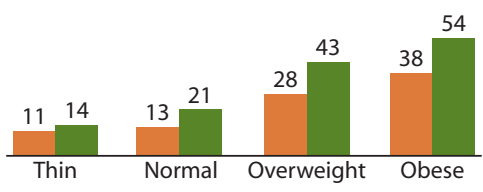
■ Ever ■ Past 12 months

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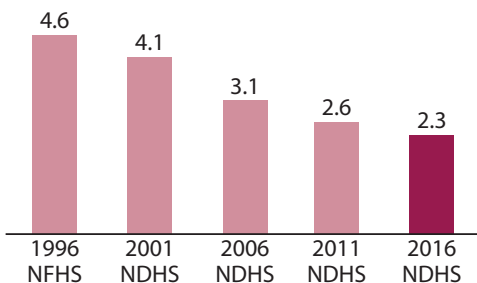
2016 Nepal Demographic and Health Survey (NDHS)

The 2016 Nepal Demographic and Health Survey (NDHS) provides data for monitoring the health situation of the population in Nepal. The survey is based on a nationally representative sample that provides estimates at the national level, for urban and rural areas, 3 ecological zones, 5 development regions, and 7 provinces.

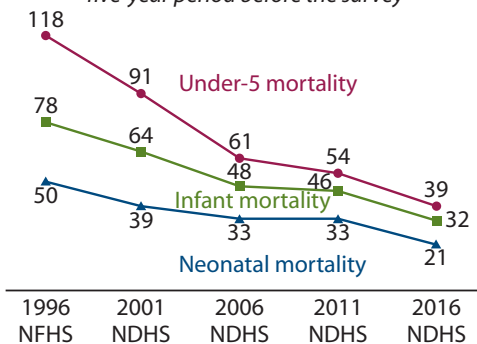
Trends in Total Fertility Rate

Births per woman for the three-year period before the survey



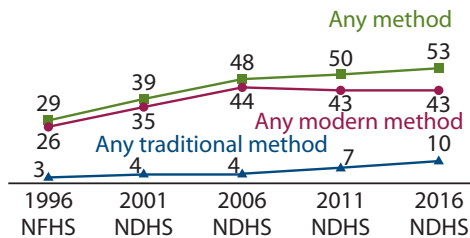
Trends in Childhood Mortality

Deaths per 1,000 live births for the five-year period before the survey



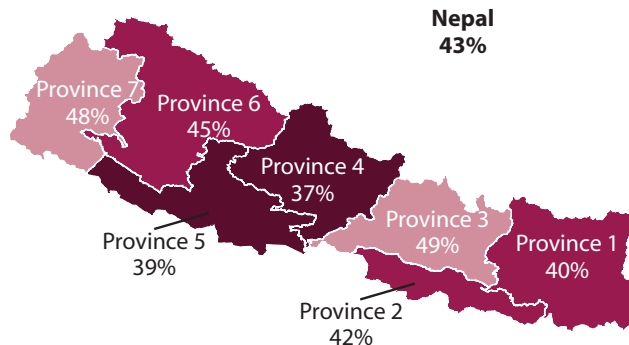
Trends in Family Planning Use

Percent of married women age 15-49 using family planning



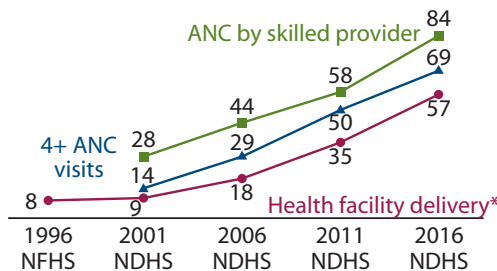
Modern Method Use by Province

Trends in Maternal Health

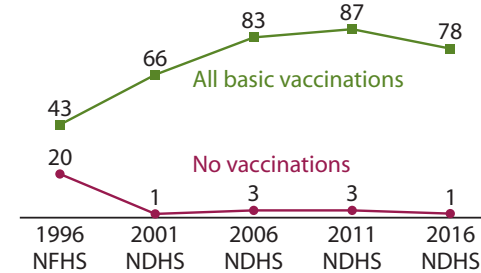
Percent of women age 15-49 who had a live birth in the five years before the survey for the most recent birth



*% of live births in the five years before the survey

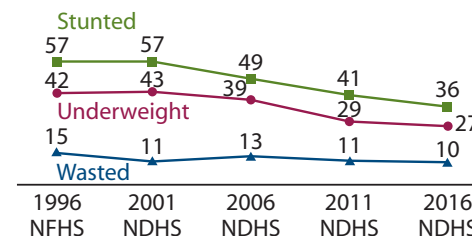
Trends in Basic Vaccination Coverage
