In this year an important workshop was conducted on piloting the SAARC Regional Pediatric Tuberculosis Guidelines and Training of Trainers Manual.

Executive Summary

SAARC Tuberculosis and HIV/AIDS Centre (STAC) was set up in 1992, as a SAARC TB Centre which later on renamed as SAARC TB and HIV/AIDS Centre, working for prevention and control of TB and HIV/AIDS in the Region by coordinating the efforts of the National Tuberculosis Control Programmes (NTPs) and National HIV/AIDS Control Programmes (NACPs) of SAARC Member States (Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Maldives, Nepal, Pakistan and Sri Lanka).

The Centre mainly coordinates for the activities related to control of TB and prevention of HIV & AIDS among the Member States, particularly in research, training, workshops etc. in technical, bio-medical, operational and other aspects to support Member States.

In this year 2016, STAC carried out almost all regular activities assigned to the Centre for the year.

In this year, STAC organized a two-day's workshop on piloting the SAARC Regional Pediatric Tuberculosis Guidelines and Training of Trainers Manual. The workshop was attended by eminent experts in childhood tuberculosis, renowned clinicians, dedicated health workers and officials. Participants were divided into 4 groups as per the topics of the guidelines to be discussed. Brainstorming discussion was held for both days to finalize the guidelines.

Dr. V. P. Myneedu, Microbiologist (SAG), Professor and Head of Department, National Institute for TB and Respiratory Diseases (NITRD), New Delhi, India appointed as a consultant and visited STAC for the purpose of development of Terms of References (ToR) for SAARC Supra-national Laboratory for TB and HIV/AIDS.

The laboratory has always played a critical role in diagnosis of tuberculosis and monitoring of treatment. The basic aim in tuberculosis laboratory is to generate accurate and reliable test results. The one of the components of quality assurance is proficiency testing of Sputum Smear Microscopy (SSM). STAC conducted its thirteenth round proficiency testing of SSM for National Reference Laboratories of SAARC Member States. Feedback has already been given to the participating laboratories to ensure their quality.

For the purpose of disseminating the information regarding TB and HIV/AIDS in the SAARC Member States, STAC has prepared different documents such as, Newsletter, Journal,

Epidemiological Reports on TB and HIV/AIDS, Wall Calendar, circulation of Guidelines and Frameworks on HIV/AIDS available in the Member States.

A website has been maintained by uploading information related to TB and HIV/AIDS, as well as publications and information on activities of the Centre.

STAC Library has been set up as SAARC Resource Centre for TB and HIV/AIDS. The library is in the process of being developed as e-library.

South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation (SAARC)

SAARC is an organization of eight countries located in the South Asia and it stands for the South Asian Association for Regional Corporation (SAARC). This is an economic and geopolitical organization, established to promote socio-economic development, stability, welfare economics, and collective self-reliance within the Region. The first summit was held in Dhaka, Bangladesh on 7-8 December 1985 and was attended by the Government Representatives and Presidents from Bangladesh, Maldives, Pakistan and Sri Lanka, the Kings of Bhutan and Nepal, and the Prime Minister of India. The dignitaries signed the SAARC Charter on 8 December 1985, thereby establishing the regional association and to carry out different important activities required for the development of the Region. The summit also agreed to establish a SAARC secretariat in Kathmandu, Nepal and adopted an official SAARC emblem. Due to rapid expansion within the region, Afghanistan received full-member status and some countries are considered as observers. SAARC respects the principles of sovereign equality, territorial integrity, and national independence as it strives to attain sustainable economic growth.

The 3% of the area of the world is represented by SAARC countries. It is around 1.72 billion of the people and it is 24% of the world population¹.

The objectives of SAARC, as defined in its charter, are as follows:

- a) to promote the welfare of the peoples of SOUTH ASIA and to improve their quality of life;
- b) to accelerate economic growth, social progress and cultural development in the region and to provide all individuals the opportunity to live in dignity and to realize their full potentials;
- c) to promote and strengthen collective self-reliance among the countries of SOUTH ASIA;
- d) to contribute to mutual trust, understanding and appreciation of one another's problems;
- e) to promote active collaboration and mutual assistance in the economic, social, cultural, technical and scientific fields;
- f) to strengthen cooperation with other developing countries;
- a) to strengthen cooperation among themselves in international forums on matters of common interests; and
- h) to cooperate with international and regional organizations with similar aims and purposes SAARC has established permanent diplomatic relations with the European Union and United Nations as observers. Foreign Ministers of the SAARC counties are met twice a year and the official

meeting of the leaders of the SAARC Member States is held once a year. The recent 18th SAARC Summit was held in the Kathmandu, Nepal on 26th and 27th November 2014. It is planned to organize 19th SAARC Summit in Pakistan. This 19th Summit has been postponed.

Regional Centers have been established in Members States in order to promote regional cooperation. These Centers are handled by Boards of representatives from all SAARC Member States and every year separate Governing Board Meeting is organized for the evaluation and monitoring of the activities of the Centres and formulation of the programmes and budget for the approval of Standing/Programming Committee of SAARC.

SAARC Tuberculosis and HIV/AIDS Centre (STAC)

The Centre was established in 1992 as SAARC Tuberculosis (STC) Centre and started functioning from 1994. The Centre had been supporting the National Tuberculosis Control Programmes of the SAARC Member States. The Thirty-first session of Standing Committee of SAARC held in Dhaka on November 09th - 10th 2005, appreciating the efforts of the

centre on TB/HIV co-infection and other works related to HIV/AIDS discipline and approved the renaming of the Centre as SAARC Tuberculosis and HIV/AIDS Centre (STAC) with additional mandate to support SAARC Member States for prevention of HIV/AIDS. Since then with its efforts and effective networking in the Member States the Centre is contributing significantly for control of both TB and HIV/AIDS.

Vision, Mission, Goal and Objective of STAC

The vision of the Centre is to be the leading institute to support and guide SAARC Member States to make the region free of TB and HIV/AIDS and the mission is to support the efforts of National TB and HIV/AIDS Control Programmes through evidence based policy guidance, coordination and technical support.

The goal of the Centre is to minimize the mortality and morbidity due to TB and HIV/AIDS in the Region and to minimize the transmission of both infections until TB and HIV/AIDS cease to be major public health problems in the SAARC Region and the objective of the Centre is to work for prevention and control of TB HIV/AIDS in the Region by coordinating the efforts of the National TB Programmes and National HIV/AIDS Programmes of the SAARC Member Countries.

Functions of STAC

- To act as a Regional Co-ordination Centre for NTPs and NACPs in the Region.
- To promote and coordinate action for the prevention of TB/HIV co-infection in the Region.
- To collect, collate, analyze and disseminate all relevant information regarding the latest development and findings in the field of TB and HIV/AIDS in the Region and elsewhere.
- To establish a networking arrangement among the NTPs and NACPs of Member States and to conduct surveys, researches etc.
- To initiate, undertake and coordinate the Research and Training in Technical Bio-medical, operational and other aspects related to control of Tuberculosis and prevention of HIV/AIDS in the Region.
- To monitor epidemiological trends of TB, HIV/AIDS and MDR-TB in the Region.
- To assist Member States for harmonization of policies and strategies on TB, HIV/AIDS and TB/HIV co-infection.
- To assist National TB Reference Laboratories in the Region in quality assurance of sputum microscopy and standardization of culture and drug sensitivity testing and implementation of bio-safety measures.
- To carry-out other important works identified by the Programming Committees/Governing Board.

Activities carried out by the SAARC TB and HIV/AIDS Centre in 2016

1. Workshop on Piloting the SAARC Regional Pediatric Tuberculosis Guidelines and Training of Trainers (ToT) Manual



1.1. Introduction

SAARC TB and HIV/AIDS Centre organized a workshop on Piloting the SAARC Regional Pediatric Tuberculosis Guidelines and Training of Trainers (ToT) Manual in Dhulikhel, Kavrepalanchowk, Nepal from 5 to 6 Sept. 2016, for the purpose of serving as an filed testing (piloting) prior to full-scale operation of both documents(Guidelines and Manual).

1.2. Objective

The objective of the workshop was piloting of the Pediatric TB Guidelines and ToT Manual as well as to build the capacity of health workers on management of Pediatric TB at their work station.

1.3. Participation

The workshop was participated by 27 participants and 10 resource persons from children hospitals, teaching hospitals and TB treatment centres of Nepal. (see annex)

1.4. Opening session

Dr. Sharat Chandra Verma, Director, STAC open the workshop by delivered the welcome address. He briefly explained the need of the piloting of the Pediatric TB Guidelines and ToT Manual. He also highlighted the urgency of the guidelines on pediatric TB control, care and support and ToT manual in SAARC Region which have been developed by the Centre.

Prof. Dr. Ramesh Kant Adhikari, Professor of Pediatrics, Kathmandu Medical Collage and resource person for the workshop highlighted the importance of scaling up the pediatric TB activities in the SAARC Region. He appreciated the efforts made by the Centre for control and prevention of pediatric TB.

Prof. Dr. Laxman Shrestha, Pediatrician, Head, Dept. of Pediatric, Tri-bhuvan University, Teaching Hospital, Kathmandu, Nepal, briefed about the importance being given to pediatric TB diagnosis and treatment in National TB Control Programme is remarkable steps by the Centre. As the children are always been neglected in TB control programme and though that they will not be infected by *Mycobacterium tuberculosis*. He emphasized the development guidelines and manual could be strengthened of overall quality of programme. He appreciated the role being played by the STAC and thanked the organizer for organizing this important workshop in time.

Dr. Bhabana Shrestha, Chief Medical Officer, German Nepal Tuberculosis Project, Nepal Anti-TB Association, Kathmandu shared her experience in diagnosis and treatment of childhood TB, as well as childhood DR TB. She elaborated the challenges faced during the diagnosis and treatment of DR TB in Children.

Dr. Prashant Rijal Assistant Professor Pediatric Pulmonologist, Nepal Medical College and Teaching Hospital, Kathmandu thanked SAAC TB and HIV/AIDS Centre for organizing this important workshop. He appreciated the efforts of the Centre towards pediatric TB and also

urged the Centre to develop child TB management and prevention as a shared responsibility under National health infrastructure.

1.5. Technical Session

Dr. Ajith Weerakoon, Epidemiologist, STAC explained the Objectives and Methodology of the Workshop. He highlighted the epidemiology of pediatric TB in SAARC region as additional information to the participants which may help them to work out on document.

Dr. Ashish Shrestha, WHO NTP, Nepal presented his presentation on Epidemiology of Tuberculosis (adult and pediatric) globally and SEA Region. He highlighted the WHO efforts for prevention and Control of Pediatric TB in the World as well as SEA Region.

Dr. Prashant Rijal, Associate Professor and Pediatrician, Nepal Medical College, Kathmandu presented his paper on "Pathology and Pathogenesis of Pediatric TB". He explained about the difficulties occurred during the time of diagnosis of child Tuberculosis.

Dr. Ramesh Kant Adhikari, Pediatrician, Kathmandu Medical College, presented his paper on "Diagnosis and Management of the case of Pediatric TB". Dr. Adhikari highlighted childhood tuberculosis and its important facts. He also elaborated on approach to diagnose TB in children. Dr. Adhikari also highlighted about types of pediatric TB found during the case-handling on children.

Dr. Bhawana Shrestha, Chief Medical Officer, GENETUP, Kathmandu presented her paper on MDR TB in Children. She shared her unforgettable experiences gained during the treatment of MDR TB in Children. She also discussed about the doses of TB medicine given to the children having TB as well as MDR TB also.

Prof. Dr. Laxman Shrestha, Tri-bhuvan University, Teaching Hospital, Kathmandu presented his presentation on "TB and HIV/AIDS Co-infection in Children". His presentation was based on approach to diagnosis of TB in Children having HIV/AIDS and their proper treatment along with the management of ART for them.

On behalf of Director, NTC, Dr. Mohan Kumar Prasai, Senior Chest Physician highlighted the activities of National TB Centre in connection with the pediatric TB.

After the discussion sessions, the participants were divided in to four groups i.e. Group A, B, C and D. Each group was led by experts as Resource Persons. The groups were assigned to review the following major topics:

- Introduction of Epidemiology of Pediatric TB
- Prevention of Pediatric Tuberculosis
- Pediatric TB Management within the NTP
- Pathology and Pathogenesis
- Case taking in Paediatric TB
- Child TB Album Work
- Case Demonstration Work
- Specimen Sampling and Microbiology
- Drug resistant TB in Children and TB-HIV Co-infection
- Management of TB in Children living with HIV/AIDS
- Approach to Diagnosis of Childhood TB
- Investigations
- Radiology of Paediatric TB
- Treatment of Pediatric TB
- Counseling in Pediatric TB

They discussed, exercised and read the Guidelines and Manual in detailed. Brainstorming discussions were held during the two days group discussion. The Guidelines and Manual reviewed/revised in accordance with the objectives and requirements.

1.6. Closing Session

Commemoration of World TB Day 2016

2. World TB Day & SAARC TB Day

2.1. Introduction

The theme of World TB Day & SAARC TB Day of this year was "Unite to End TB". The slogan was "Unite to End TB Strategy" which aims address social and other barriers by eliciting a strong, systemic response to end the TB epidemic, drawing on the



opportunities provided by the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG), especially those goals aimed at achieving universal health coverage and social protection from disease. The theme also offers a message of urgency in continuation of sustained effort and shared responsibility. Through unified action at all levels, we have to accelerate work to move towards a world free of Tuberculosis. The theme emphasizes that although TB is a curable disease, still it remains a major public health problem. Achieving the TB-focused targets of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) depends on effectively raising and addressing country-level challenges through a unified global campaign and multi-sectoral approach. By mobilizing communities, raising awareness, encouraging governments and donors to invest in TB control, and calling for strengthened commitment, we can ensure that TB is eliminated by 2035.

SAARC TB and HIV/AIDS Centre (STAC) and its partners are committed that the Region free of TB. STAC is one of the Regional Centres of SAARC working for prevention and control of TB and HIV/AIDS in the region with an objective to coordinate the efforts of the National TB Control Programmes (NTPs) and National AIDS Control Programmes (NACPs) of SAARC Member States.

Considering the situation of the problem of TB, organized Advocacy Centre Awareness Activities generate the knowledge on TB, specially its prevention and control strategy on the occasion of World TB Day/SAARC TB Day of this year which were as under:

2.2. Activities:

2.2. 1. Publication of Message of H. E.

Message issued by His Excellency Mr. Arjun Bahadur Thapa, Secretary General, SAARC was published on Centre's website and National TB circulated to the Control Programmes (NTPs) of SAARC States for publication on National Newspapers on the occasion of Word TB Day 2016.



2.2.2. Interaction Programme on TB Control Management with Students of Bachelor in Public Health (BPH)

Introduction:

Medical students can play an important role in the National efforts to manage TB patients and save lives. They are in a unique position to reach various levels of health care providers. They have the potential to create a new generation of health professionals who have updated knowledge about priority communicable diseases such as TB. On this occasion a one-day Interaction Programme on Tuberculosis and its Prevention & Control Strategy with Students of Bachelor in Public Health (BPH) was organized by STAC at Thimi, Bhaktapur, Nepal on 18th March, 2016.



The objectives of the programme were:

- to create public awareness on tuberculosis control,
- to discuss the role of college students on spreading of awareness in community
- to disseminate updated information on TB and its control and
- to seek coordination and cooperation for controlling efforts on TB

Participation

About 100 students and teachers participated in the programme as participants from the college. Staff working in NTP Nepal also attended the programme. The programme started with arrival of the students, teacher, resource persons and guests. The participants registered their names and obtained STAC publications as resource materials, awareness materials and stationeries.

Proceedings of the programme

To enhance the community involvement & active participation of the people in TB control, STAC has developed its strategy to initiate partnerships with different stakeholders by organizing interaction programmes on the special occasions of World TB Day, World AIDS Day and SAARC Charter Day every year.

Dr. Sharat Chandra Verma, Director, STAC, welcomed all the dignitaries, participants and highlighted the Introduction of STAC objectives of commemoration of World TB day and current situation of TB in SAARC Region. He emphasized high priority on Public Private Mix programme in TB control. Dr. Verma highlighted the ways how to reach to un-reached and marginalized population. He also highlighted the End TB Strategy and its vision to eliminate TB. He thanked to the officials from the different organizations and students/teachers for participating the programme.

Dr. Bikash Lamichhane, Director, National TB Centre, Nepal presented a paper on National Scenario of Tuberculosis in Nepal and efforts being made by NTP Nepal.

Dr. Bhesh Raj Pokheral, Sr. Integrated Medical Officer on behalf of Dr. Tarun Poudel, Director, National Centre for AIDS & STD Control, Nepal presented a paper on current situation of HIV/AIDS and TB/HIV Co-infection in Nepal. He informed that Isoniazid Prophylaxis treatments are available in all ART sites in Nepal. He said, at present, there are 2.4% of TB patients are infected with HIV and 11% of PLHIV are infected with TB He urged to be strengthened the collaboration between TB and HIV/AIDS Control Programmes.

Dr. Keshav Yogi, WHO focal Person for NTP Nepal, highlighted the Global Scenario of TB control with its burden, achievements and efforts for stopping the tuberculosis.

Mr. Dhrub Khadka, Microbiologist, National TB Centre, Nepal explained about the development of TB diagnosis, Lab Net-work and Gene-Xpert services in Nepal.

Discussion

After technical presentation, a discussion session was held. Participants raised different queries about TB control status in Nepal as well as in the world. Mainly, the discussion was focused on Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) to Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), Childhood TB and Urban TB Programme. Resource Persons/Directors of National TB Control Programme, Nepal and National AIDS Control Programme, Nepal explained the situation.

On behalf of the participating Colleges, Mr. Nawaraj Pandey, Chairman, Nobel College of Health & Education Foundation expressed his views and thanked STAC for inviting them to attend the programme. Mr. Pandey proposed during his speech to develop a MoU between STAC/NTP Nepal and Nobel College to take TB control programme to door-to-door in the community.

Dr. Sharat Chandra Verma, Director STAC delivered the vote of thanks and closing remarks and awarded the Souvenir to the representatives of participating colleges. He also delivered the closing remarks and vote of thanks.

STAC publications related to tuberculosis were distributed to all the participants.


Day and World Hepatitis Day. Since 1995, the President of the United States has made an official proclamation on World AIDS Day.

The status of the activities – Information was circulated widely in the SAARC Member States through e-mails and internet. No any Member State applied for the research except Nepal. National Tuberculosis Centre (NTP as well) applied, however did not continue the process even several notification of STAC.

7. Presentation and Dissemination of Research Findings on TB & HIV/AIDS through participation in International Conferences

- Participation in the 47th UNION World Conference on Lung Health

Dr. Sharat Chandra Verma, Director, STAC participated in the 47th UNION World Conference organized in Liverpool, UK from 26th to 29th Oct. 2016. In the Conference most of the National Programme Managers of TB Control in SAARC Member States participated, congregated and utilize the opportunity to share their experiences and renewal their cooperation required for the control of TB in the Region.

8. Presentation & Dissemination of Research Findings on TB & HIV/AIDS and Capacity Building on the Technical and Managerial Skills of Personnel of STAC by Participating in the Regional Conferences/trainings, workshops etc. in the Member States

Under this pogramme Director, STAC had participated in different National and International Events related to TB and HIV/AIDS, which are as follows:

i. 12th International Congress on AIDS in Asia and the Pacific (ICAAP I2) 12th – 14th March, 2016, Dhaka Bangladesh

Dr. Sharat Chandra Verma, Director, STAC participated in the 12th International Congress on AIDS in Asia and the Pacific (ICAAP I2), Dhaka, Bangladesh on 12th – 14th March 2016. The visit was performed at the invitation of UNICEF, ROSA. The STAC has its aim to disseminate new research findings, and achievements by participating in Regional Conferences in the Member States as well as in other countries.

The Director Co-chaired a satellite session under the title "Improving Access and Coverage of HIV Prevention, Testing and Treatment Services for Adolescents, Asia and Pacific ("ALL IN" ADOLESCENTS)". The facts of the session were; adolescents (aged 10-19 years) are the only age group where AIDS-related deaths are not decreasing, among adolescents, AIDS the second most common cause of death globally, seeks to reduce AIDS-related deaths by 65%, reduce new HIV infections by 75% and eliminate HIV/AIDS related stigma and discrimination among adolescents by 2020.

The vision of ICAAP12 was an opportunity to firmly entrench communities' efforts to promote the game changers with respect to AIDS prevention, treatment, care and support

in the Asia Pacific region that will lead to shared vision in the post 2015 agenda and end AIDS by 2030.

The objectives of participation in ICAAP12:

- To provide the information on current status of HIV and AIDS in the SAARC Region.
- To advocate the SAARC Regional Strategy on HIV/AIDS in international forum.

ii. Participation in PPM Workshop, NTP Nepal

Dr. S. C. Verma, Director, STAC participated in the Public-Private Mix (PPM) workshop in TB Control organized by NTP Nepal in different parts of central region of Nepal from 5th to 8th July 2016. The objective of the workshop was to provide TB orientation to Medical Officer from government as well as private hospitals, Medical Colleges, Nursing Homes etc. One of the major functions of STAC is to support Member States in strengthening/updating the knowledge and skills of existing manpower working in control of TB and HIV/AIDS upon the request of Member States. Dr. Verma contributed in the workshop as a TB expert and main resource person. The workshop was conducted at Birguni, Janakpur and Chitawan districts of Nepal.

Regional Review Meeting of Far-western Region, Nepal

 12th – 13th April 2016, Male, Maldives

Dr. Sharat Chandra Verma, Director, STAC participated in the sixth meeting in SEAR Technical Working Group on Tuberculosis (TWG-TB) was in Male, Maldives from 12th - 13th April 2016 at the invitation of WHO/SEARO. The objective of the meeting was to provide guidance on the implementation of the "End TB Strategy" for TB care and control interventions in countries of the Region.

The General objective of the meeting was to provide guidance on the implementation of the "End TB Strategy" for TB care and control interventions in countries of the Region and the specific objectives were as follows:

- to review the progress and identify challenges and constraints in implementing activities based on recommendations of TWG meeting (2014) in the countries of the Region;
- to review and discuss the Regional Strategic Plan 2016-2020;
- to provide guidance on adopting and applying revised WHO policies and guidelines for more comprehensively addressing in the specific context of countries in the Region:
- to provide technical guidance on identification of specific need of technical support from WHO and other partners in relation with the activities proposed for the 2016-2017 biennium in the countries of the region.

ii. Participation in 9th Meeting of the Regional Advisory Committee on MDR-TB

Dr. Sharat Chandra Verma, Director, STAC participated at the 9th Meeting of the Regional Advisory Committee on MDT-TB organized by WHO/SEARO held in Kathmandu, 17th - 19th Oct. 2016. Since, STAC is only one Collaborating Centre (CC) of WHO in Nepal.

iii. Regional Workshop on Introduction of New Drugs & Regimens for DR-TB treatment in SEAR, New Delhi, India, 18th – 19th August, 2016

Dr. S. C. Verma, Director, STAC participated in the above mentioned workshop organized by The Union East Asia (USEA) in collaboration with KNVC, Challenge TB, and with support from CDC and USAID in New Delhi, India from 18th to 19th August

2016. The objectives of the workshop were to provide updates on current WHO policies related to new drugs and regimens for DR TB and mechanisms to access these drugs; to discuss preparatory activities for the introduction of new drugs and regimens under programmatic conditions and to share experiences of countries and partner organizations who have introduced new regimens for the treatment of DR TB cases.

The recent WHO recommendations on the use of shorter treatment regimens and Second Line Drug Susceptibility Testing (SL DST) are expected to radically change the management of DR TB. Several countries in the South-East Asia with high burden of DR TB stand to benefit from these new recommendations. However, it will be critical that the countries take necessary steps to adopt and implement them quickly. This workshop brought together the National TB Programme (NTP) Managers, NTP focal persons for DR TB, TB partners and experts; and provided an opportunity to provide updates to ensure strengthening of capacity to rapidly introduce shorter regimens and new drugs for the treatment of DR TB with a focus on the **Bedaquiline** and **Delamanid** containing regimens and 9 month shorter treatment regimen

iv. 3rd International Conference of South East Asia Region (SEAR) of the UNION, 26th – 27th May 2016, Kathmandu, Nepal

The 3rd International Conference of South East Asia Region (SEAR) of The UNION was organized from 26th to 27th May 2016, Kathmandu, Nepal.

People from the South-east Asia Region and abroad participated in the conference. The theme of the conference was "TB and Lung Health", which reflects that TB; to a great extent is a lung disease. SAARC TB and HIV/AIDS Centre supported for organizing the conference.

Dr. S. C. Verma, Director, STAC chaired "Free Paper Presentation Session VIII on Tuberculosis, "Symposium on Tobacco Control in the SAARC Countries Where are We for Achieving WHO FCTC Recommendations" and "Symposium on Tobacco Cessation into Regular TB services from TB patients in Low income countries"

Dr. Ajith Weerakoon, Epidemiologist, STAC co-chaired the Symposium, Oral presentation on Adult & Child Health related to TB epidemiology. He also presented papers on "Constraint of Involvement of General Practitioners in the National TB Control Programme in Sri Lanka" in plenary sessions.

11. Thirteenth Round Proficiency Testing of SSM for NRLs of SAARC Member States

SAARC TB Reference Laboratory (STRL) has a good networking for Quality Assurance of Sputum Microscopy with the Ten National TB Reference Laboratories (NRLs) of the Member States under NTP. STRL has been supporting NRLs in the area of Quality Assurance (QA) of microscopy network. Standardization of culture and Drug Susceptibility Testing (DST) and the implementation of international Bio-safety measures are the other challenges. Panel Testing is one of the three components for External Quality Assessment (EQA) or proficiency testing. STRL conducted first round of proficiency testing in Member States in 2003. Since then STRL has been conducting the annual rounds of Proficiency Testing on its own. STRL has completed the Thirteenth Round of Proficiency Testing in 2016.


13. Publication and Distribution

Visit of STAC by Executives from Johnson & Johnson


